In The Beginning..., our beginning, I was content to go about my business on Sunday morning without thinking much beyond mowing the lawn. When Stephanie told me that she was going to attend church in Sewell, 14 miles away, I was dumbfounded. Why? With Whom? Though we had been married in the Catholic Church about five years before, we had not attended Mass much since. What was the attraction to attend this church?

I stayed home each week and waved goodbye as she got into a stranger's car, waiting for this new phase to pass, but it didn't. Eventually, I agreed to go with her one Sunday, to make sure that she wasn't getting involved with some crazy cult. What I encountered was a group of Christians who were great singers, knowledgeable Bible teachers, and talkative pew mates. Most amazing was that each one was genuinely thrilled to see me there.

Is this still the image we project to someone who walks in the door for the first time?

It didn't stop there. Dwight and MaryLea (the strangers in the car), Dan, and many others held weekly Bible studies in our home with a growing group of young couples. Always included in these gatherings were fellowship and food. We attended pot luck dinners, picnics, and lunches after church. Before long, we had forged real relationships with a number of members. So when I was shown where the Bible said that I needed to be "born again" for the forgiveness of my sins, I didn't run away, as I would have if a stranger had pointed out the same words to me.

This is the essence of our area of ministry. Only by spending time together in activities beyond the formal worship setting do we build deep relationships and trust. It has been 30 years for us. Our group remains close. We have enjoyed celebrations and endured trials together. We are family.

Beginning next Sunday, the shopping list/bags for the "Pack the Pulpit Sunday", will be available in the foyer. coming up, November 22nd.


If you are not familiar with this
