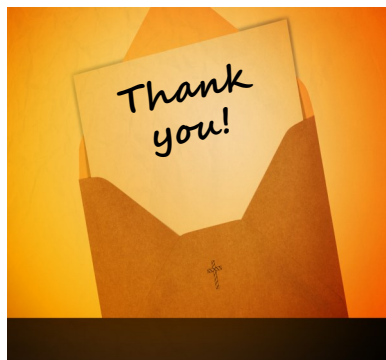

Something New Just Started on Sunday Mornings

Our Vision: Becoming a place where God's love is experienced, known and shared by all.

We are always attempting to be sensitive to the needs of those who come forward expressing concerns during our traditional "invitation song." We want everyone, male and female, young and not-so-young, to experience God's love. With that sensitivity in mind, in addition to an elder or two coming to the front of the auditorium as we sing at the conclusion of the Sunday sermons (which we have done for years now), elders' wives will be available down front to meet, pray and counsel with any sisters who come forward. This decision has been made specifically to help us be more sensitive to women who respond to the invitation.

In addition, an elder and his wife will be available for private meetings and private, confidential prayer immediately after our Sunday morning assembly in two different locations. One elder and wife will be available in the **Conference Room** and one elder and wife will meet in the **Lavender Ladies Room** each Sunday, should you want to discuss and pray over issues of a more sensitive nature. They will be in each room for about ten to fifteen minutes each Sunday morning, following the final "Amen," should you chose to avail yourself of a time of prayer and sharing. Please feel free to take full advantage of this new opportunity extended by our elders and their wives.

We care! And during this month of renewed emphasis on prayer, the timing just seemed perfect. So, on any given Sunday morning, elders and elder's wives will be available to meet with you, to hear your concerns and to pray, on the spot, for and with you! One "problem with prayer" is that sometimes we just need to share our prayer concerns with someone of the same gender.

Shepherd's Voice

A Powerful Little Word

"I love you." "I am sorry." "I forgive you." What do these three phrases have in common? The single letter word "I." How powerful this little word can be! If followed by words such as those above, the word "I" can be very positive. The Bible records words of Jesus that support these positive "I" statements. In John 13:34, Jesus says, "As I have loved you, so you must love one another." In Matthew 5:23-24, Jesus says, "If you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother." And in Matthew 6:14, Jesus says, "If you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."

However, this little word can also be very powerful in a negative way. "I hate you!" "I am great!" "I want things done my way." The Bible clearly indicates hate, pride and selfishness are all sins. In 1 John 2:9, we are warned, "Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness." Proverbs 16:18 says, "Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall." And with respect to selfishness, James 3:16-17 says, "Where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice. But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere."

Use the word "I" very carefully. As the old saying goes, there is no "I" in the word "team". We are all part of one team – God's team, the body of Christ! Let us function as a team, not seeking our own desires. Remember what Paul says in 1 Corinthians: "I am not seeking my own good but the good of many, so that they may be saved" (10:33) and "I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some" (9:22).


