#### Amazing Grace...How Sweet the Sound...

You know the story of how that song came to be, right? If you don't, you need to! Please take a few minutes to "Google" the name John Newton, or in some way search out the background information on the story of this classic Christian hymn. John Newton was born in 1725. He was not the kind of young man you'd want to be your son's best friend. Before becoming a Christian he was a rebel, atheist, blasphemer, fornicator and slave trader. But...

In his book, The Jesus I Never Knew, Philip Yancey related the true story that started like this... "A prostitute came to me in wretched straits, unable to buy food for her two-yearold daughter." Through sobs and tears, she told me all the graphic details. As the sordid story unfolded, specific after sickeningly specific detail, the minister who reached out to down-and-out Chicago prostitute struggled to offer help. Eventually he "asked her if she had ever thought of going to a church for help." He said he'd never forget the look of pure and naïve shock on her face. "Church!" she cried. "Why would I ever go there? I was already feeling terrible about myself. They'd just make me feel worse!"

What strikes me about that story is that when Jesus walked the earth, the prostitutes and sinners fled toward Jesus, not away from him. The worse a person felt about himself/ herself, the more likely they saw Jesus as a refuge. Has the church lost that gift?

During our series of sermons this coming month, we are going to be sharing in a study on what Yancey calls "the last best word." You will be challenged. You will be humbled. You will be fearful! You will have the widest range of human emotions...from rage and embarrassment to relief and pure joy! Don't miss this exciting series! Get me to the church on time!


