From Daniel's Den

Grace Was Born in a Manger in Bethlehem

I am thrilled to experience the love, joy and grace that seems to be a bit more obvious at this time of the year. I only wish this love, joy and grace continued throughout the other 11 months of the year! In his convicting book, "What's So Amazing About Grace?" Philip Yancey observes, "Christians in general are not doing such a good job of dispensing grace." And, I think he's right! We could do a much better job as "grace dispensers."

In the same way that our Heavenly Father dispenses grace and forgiveness to us, He calls us to dispense grace and forgiveness to others. But, we find it hard to forgive. Forgiveness is not natural. Our natural self says to "get even." Natural self says to "hold a grudge." Natural self says to "settle the account." Jesus says, forgive, extend grace.

Three pragmatic reasons why we should forgive:

- 1. "Forgiveness alone can halt the cycle of blame and pain, breaking the chain of ungrace." Martin Luther wrote, "Think of all the squabbles Adam and Eve must have had in the course of their 900 years." He went on to say, Eve would accuse Adam of eating the fruit and Adam would retort, "You gave it to me." (p. 95)
- 2. Forgiveness can "loosen the stranglehold of guilt in the perpetrator."
- 3. "Forgiveness breaks the cycle of blame and loosens the stranglehold of guilt." (p. 104) "Forgiveness—undeserved, unearned—can cut the cords and let the oppressive burden of guilt roll away." That is precisely what Jesus did when, even after Peter's repeated denials before the crucifixion; after the resurrections, Jesus said to him. "Feed my sheep!" (pp. 96 -104)

"The world can do anything that the church can do except one thing: it cannot show grace."
