Walking the Spiritual Wire

In 1974, New Yorkers stared skyward from the sidewalks below the World Trade Center towers. They watched a lone figure walking in the air between the top of the skyscrap-

In reality, Phillipe Petit, an accomplished wire walker, had strung a wire across the chasm of the twin towers and was walking the wire. His story became the basis for the 2015 movie The Walk (which should not be viewed by those afraid of heights).

Petit learned the art of wire walking as part of a circus family. As he grew, he gained confidence, perhaps too much confidence. During a practice session, the patriarch, Papa Ruby, watched the young Phillipe as he approached his last step. Then it happened. The wire started to shake, and Phillipe slipped. He grabbed the wire with both hands, swinging precariously. One errant move would drop him to his death. He edged himself to the platform, onto which he collapsed.

The stress of the near fall weakened Phillipe's knees and jangled his nerves as he descended the ladder and faced the old man, expecting criticism. But Papa Ruby did not scold. He instructed Phillipe, "Most wire walkers, they die when they arrive. They think they have arrived, but they're still on the wire. If you have three steps to do, and you take those steps arrogantly, if you think you are invincible, you're going to die!"


King Solomon could not agree more. His words are more familiar yet just a potent: "Pride goes before destruction and a haughty spirit before a fall." (Proverbs 16:18)

The most dangerous thought to have about the Christian life is, "I am above all of this." Temptation is real, and some version of the siren's song entices all. Those, like Peter, who are sure of their strength confront their weakness in tears. All walk the spiritual wire daily. We must do it cautiously with faith only in Christ, and not ourselves.

Remember the lesson of the wire walker. If you think you are invincible, you are dead.
