The Problem with Sunday School and LIFE Groups!

The church of the first century did not have Sunday school, as nearly as I can tell. Rather, Sunday school is a relatively modern innovation in churches. Sunday school programs were started in England in the 1780's by a man named Robert Raikes. Within a few decades Sunday school programs had become very popular in England, and the movement crossed the Atlantic and came to America. Through Sunday school programs, millions of children and adults have been taught the basics of Christianity. And, through Sunday school haven't we all been deeply blessed by the things we learn? I would not want to go to a church that did not have an active Sunday school program.

The church of the first century did not have LIFE Groups, as nearly as I can tell. Rather, church every Sunday was more like our typical LIFE Group in 21st century America. Home meetings, food, fellowship, and lots of application time for the teachings of Jesus were the norm for the church of the first century. Churches gradually drifted away from that 1st century model as church became more accepted and moved into church buildings. About 40 years ago, a "small group" movement sprung up in America. Churches began to move back into homes for small group meetings (or LIFE Group meetings) where people could share "food, fellowship and lots of application time for the teachings of Jesus."

The problem with Sunday school and LIFE Groups is that every single Christian does not take full advantage of these wonderful opportunities every week! We usually have only about 55% to 65% of our Sunday morning attendance participating in Sunday school and LIFE Groups. As September approaches, JUST DO IT! Take full advantage of our wonderful Sunday school classes and our dynamic LIFE Group ministry. GROW!

Wednesday Night Meals will resume on Wednesday, September 14th!






