The Pilgrims and Thanksgiving...

Dramatic and significant is the story of the Pilgrims. On December 21, 1620, the Mayflower dropped anchor in Plymouth Bay, with Captain Christopher Jones at her helm. It had been a grueling voyage, taking the 120-ton-capacity ship sixty-six days to make the perilous crossing...with disease, anxiety, and childbirth among the 102 courageous passengers. Furthermore, they arrived on the shore during a hard winter. That winter claimed half of their number! However, when spring came and the captain of the Mayflower offered free passage to anyone desiring to return, not a single person accepted.

The fidelity of the forty-one men, who while still aboard the Mayflower had signed the famous Mayflower Compact beginning with the words, "In ye name of God Amen," was taking on visible meaning. These adventuresome and faithful souls had dedicated themselves to freedom. They had come to a wilderness to carve out a better way of life. Faith prompted the voyage; faith sustained the Pilgrims and their religious convictions constrained them to raise their voices in praise and thanksgiving as they first came ashore. Their hardships, sacrifice, devotion, concept of government, and vigorous religion all remind and inspire us to greater gratitude for the Providence of God.

Today we continue our one month focus upon thanksgiving and gratitude. (We started last Sunday with my challenge to you to write down 1,000 gifts. I am now up to 465-but I had a head start on you.) It has been said that Thanksgiving is a window to reality; our chief means of spiritual perception. How wonderful then that the final Thursday of November is dedicated for the celebration of Thanksgiving!

But we have some work to do. We often live in unrecognized idolatry, failing to see or to trust in the reality and grace of God. Our beliefs about God become merely empty words. Paul speaks to this in Roman 1:21, "For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God OR GIVE THANKS TO HIM, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened."

- voung couples in the Mediterranean World?


Would you like to use some of your construction, cleaning, carpentry, landscaping, or other skills to build up God's kingdom?

<u>Praise:</u> Thanksgiving for our willing volunteers who serve at fellowship meals and various luncheons!


Prayers Requested:
