### PITMAN ROAD UNIVERSITY - Matthew: The Gospel of the King and His Kingdom - Derrick Busch - Family Life Center

For those of us who live in a modern democracy, the ideas of "king" and "kingdom" can be hard to grasp, and even harder to make a reality in our lives. For the Jews in the first century, it was an ever-present reality – and a greatly desired expectation. According to the Old Testament, a king from God would come who would establish Judah as an everlasting kingdom and free them from domination of other world powers. In his gospel, Matthew introduces Jews to the King they longed to see. For him, it was absolutely Good News. In our own lives today, we need the good news of the King and the Kingdom over which He reigns. What is this Kingdom? What kind of King do we have? What does it mean to be a citizen of this Kingdom? Matthew has much to teach us.

### 18 Years, and Still Learning to Understand and Honor.

This past Monday, Becky and I celebrated our 18th wedding anniversary. The occasion caused me to think about the condition of my own marriage in comparison to God's plan for marriage. The biblical ideal for marriage has been perfectly modeled for us through the life and ministry of Christ. Just as Christ loves and accepts each of us unconditionally with all our flaws and weaknesses, we are called to love and accept our spouse unconditionally. Just as Christ has no limit to the number of times he will forgive us when we fail, there is no limit to the number of times we are to forgive our spouse. Just as Christ sacrificed himself and died for our sake, we are called to place the desires of our spouse ahead of our own. These are easy sentences to write, but so hard to put into practice in our marriages. The great news is that we have the example of Christ to continually refer to, and the Bible which is full of marriage examples (good and bad) and marriage advice, including this commandment to husbands found in 1Peter 3:7 (NLT):

# In the same way, you husbands must give honor to your wives. Treat your wife with understanding as you live together.

Lately I have come to realize that as a husband I have fallen short when it comes to this verse. I have too often shown a lack of honor to Becky by placing my own interests ahead of hers. I have also too often shown a lack of understanding for what Becky is dealing with in her life, as well as a lack of appreciation for all she does for my sake, and for the sake of our children. This lack of honor and understanding has wounded our relationship, but thank God we have forgiveness, and the opportunity to start over again each day with a renewed effort to align our own marriage to God's plan. Striving for a Godly marriage is not easy, but so worth it!

All women who participated in our prayer groups, and for women interested in participating at another time are invited!


