#### LOVE IS...

Are you struggling with engaging in a meaningful devotional time? Paul Tripp in his devotional, "The Invitation To Love," focuses his attention on 23 things that **LOVE IS...** 

This is a powerful, practical, and user friendly way to remind that **LOVE IS...** 

- LOVE IS... being willing to have your life complicated by the needs and struggles of others without impatience or anger.
- LOVE IS...actively fighting the temptation to be critical and judgmental toward another while looking for ways to encourage and praise.
- LOVE IS...making a daily commitment to resist the needless moments of conflict that come from pointing out and responding to minor offenses.
- LOVE IS... being lovingly honest and humbly approachable in times of misunderstanding.
- LOVE IS...being more committed to unity and understanding than you are to winning, accusing, or being right.
- 6. LOVE IS... making a daily commitment to admit your sin, weakness, and failure and to resist the temptation to offer an excuse or shift the blame.
- LOVE IS... being willing, when confronted by another, to examine your heart rather than rising to your defense or shifting the focus.
- LOVE IS...making a daily commitment to grow in love so that the love you offer to another is increasingly selfless, mature, and patient.
- LOVE IS... being unwilling to do what is wrong when you have been wronged, but looking for concrete and specific ways to overcome evil with good.
- 10. LOVE IS... being a good student of another, looking for their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs so that in some way you can remove the burden, support them as they carry it, or encourage them along the way.
- 11. LOVE IS... being willing to invest the time necessary to discuss, examine, and understand the relational problems you face, staying on task until the problem is removed or you have agreed upon a strategy of response.
- 12. LOVE IS... being willing to always ask for forgiveness and always being committed to grant forgiveness when it is requested...
- **13. LOVE IS...** recognizing the high value of trust in a relationship and being faithful to your promises and true to your word.

- 14. LOVE IS...speaking kindly and gently, even in moments of disagreement, refusing to attack the other person's character or assault their intelligence.
- 15. LOVE IS... being unwilling to flatter, lie, manipulate, or deceive in any way in order to co-opt the other person into giving you what you want or doing something your way.
- 16. LOVE IS...being unwilling to ask another person to be the source of your identity, meaning, and purpose, or inner sense of well-being, while refusing to be the source of theirs.
- 17. LOVE IS...the willingness to have less free time, less sleep, and a busier schedule in order to be faithful to what God has called you to be and to do as a spouse, parent, neighbor, etc.
- 18. LOVE IS...a commitment to say no to selfish instincts and to do everything that is within your ability to promote real unity, functional understanding, and active love in your relationship.
- 19. LOVE IS...staying faithful to your commitment to treat another with appreciation, respect, and grace, even in moments when the other person doesn't seem deserving or is unwilling to reciprocate.
- 20. LOVE IS... the willingness to make regular and costly sacrifices for the sake of a relationship without asking for anything in return or using your sacrifices to place the other person in your debt.
- 21. LOVE IS... being unwilling to make any personal decision or choice that would harm a relationship, hurt the other person, or weaken the bond of trust between you.
- 22. LOVE IS... refusing to be self-focused or demanding, but instead looking for specific ways to serve, support, and encourage, even when you are busy or tired.
- 23. LOVE IS...daily admitting to yourself, the other person, and God that you are unable to be driven by a cruciform love without God's protecting, providing, forgiving, rescuing, and delivering grace.

# The Discipline of Preaching the Gospel to Ourselves (Part 2)

On August 6<sup>th</sup>, I shared with you the spiritual discipline or practice of preaching the Gospel to ourselves from Paul Tripp. Yes! As stated previously we all preach to ourselves daily. The question is, "What are we preaching to ourselves?" Remember, we are our biggest influencers! If you recall the words of Paul Tripp that I shared previously, "No one is more influential in your life than you are. Because no one talks to you more than you do." Again, what gospel message do we preach to ourselves on a daily basis? The messages that we preach to ourselves are packed with the power to influence the way that we live and decisions that we make. Here's a more pivotal question, what gospel message do we preach to ourselves when we're angry, fearful, in a panic, and or discouraged? In these difficult times, do I forget what I say I believe or confess about Jesus Christ? Do you forget what you say you believe or confess about Jesus Christ? In other words, when we face the trials of life, are we able to preach (Romans 8:37-39) to ourselves? Here's the text, "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Are we able to preach to ourselves and experience the peace, comfort and assurance that's offered in this text during difficult times? Paul Tripp puts it this way, "In our sin, we constantly find our responses to life in our fallen world to be disconnected from the theology that we confess. Anger, fear, panic, discouragement stalk our hearts and whispers in our ears a false gospel that will lure our lives away from what we say we believe." Wow! Let's encourage one another to preach the Gospel to ourselves and actively believe!
