Genesis Part 1: What Were We Put in the World to Do? (Pitman Road University class) - Garth Hutchinson - Family Life Center It is far too easy to read the first chapters of Genesis with the questions of our time: "Were the days of creation 24 hours long?" "How long ago did this happen?" "Is this history or myth?" "How does this square with modern views of science and evolution?" Of course, these are important questions and we can probably learn some things from Genesis 1-11 that are relevant to them.

But we don't learn very much from a text if we ask questions that it was not written to answer. Genesis is, frankly, about deeper issues than biological origins. It answers questions such as: "What are human beings?" "Why are we here?" "What is our relationship to the nature and the world?" Essentially, Genesis is not about the "How" of creation but rather about the "Why". That is, ultimately, far more important.




