Shepherd's Voice

Shammah

In 2 Samuel 23, we read the fascinating story Shammah, one of King David's mighty warriors. During a particular battle, the Israelites were overrun by the enemy and pushed to the edge of a field. All of Israel fled, but Shammah took his stand in the middle of the field. The text says that he defeated the enemy and the Lord brought about a great victory that day.

The Israelite army was overwhelmed with fear, but there was one faithful warrior who would not let his destiny be defined by his fear. People like Shammah create a problem for many of us. They disrupt the narrative of what seems a reasonable option. The Israelites were out numbered, but Shammah changed the standard, choosing to fight for the future of his people. What was it about that moment that inspired this warrior to take a stand? We can imagine him saying, "This is worth fighting for. This is who I am. I will not allow fear to move me from where I should be to where it wants me to be."

All of us, whether consciously or unconsciously, find a piece of ground where we choose to take a stand, whether out of fear or by conviction. The apostle Paul tells Timothy to take a stand and "fight the good fight of faith." In essence, Paul encourages Timothy to fight for what truly matters. He must fight for the future of the church, which ultimately leads to eternal life.

As faithful followers of Christ, we must have the same attitude as Shammah. There is a future worth fighting for. Fear cannot define who we are or where we will go. By faith, we can move outside ourselves and meet others where they are in Jesus name. I believe God has great plans for our church. If God is the God of yesterday, today, and tomorrow, then tomorrow should fill us with inexplicable hope.


