Choosing A Life That Matters "Serve God, Not Self"

If I choose to live a life that matters, I am required to serve something or someone bigger than myself! When I choose to serve God, I choose not to serve sin or men! I choose not to serve the world or the deceiver. And, I choose not to serve my feelings or my own comfort! In short, when I choose to serve God, I say "No" to serving self!

To illustrate, when the young and handsome Joseph was in Egypt and a beautiful, rich, and provocative woman "came on to him", Joseph said "No" to sin and it ended him in prison(Gen. 39:7). When **Shadrach, Meshach**, and **Abednego** were called to serve men, they said, "No" to serving men; and they were thrown into a fiery furnace (Dan. 3:12-16). When the deceiver took Jesus to a very high mountain and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world, **Jesus** said, "No," to the world and no to the deceiver (Mt. 4:8). Whereas insubordinate, empty talkers, and deceivers, refuse to confess Jesus Christ as Lord, believers confess Him (Titus 1:10 & 2 John 1:7). **Abraham** choose not to follow his feelings, but rather he wandered to a foreign land, living in tents, not knowing where he was going (Heb. 11:9-10). Mary was discovered to be with child, and the child was not "fathered" by **Joseph**, yet **Joseph** chose not to serve his own feelings (Matt. 1:19-20).

Application: Saying "No" to self means I don't put everything in my mouth I'd like, because I want to lose 20 pounds. Saying "No" to self means I exercise, when I'd rather sit in front of the TV. Saying "No" to self, means I say "Yes" to a lower paying job because I think God can best use me there. Saying "No" to temptation may mean saying "No" to that first drink because my past history proves that one drink inevitable leads to drunkenness. Saying "No" to self means saying "No" to that shopping trip for those new shoes or that new outfit!



I wanted to take a moment – on behalf of Robin, my brother -Jim, his wife – Trish, and me – to thank you for the outpouring of love that so many of you expressed to our family on the passing of my Dad, Harry Steward. You honored us and my Dad with your prayers, attendance at his funeral, cards, gifts, hugs, and donations to the expansion fund. I don't want to name names for fear of forgetting someone, but I wanted to especially thank those of you that participated in his funeral service and served us by planning, setting up, preparing, serving, and cleaning up after the luncheon. Even before he passed, you honored him by your visits to the hospital, cards, sitting with him during mealtime at the rehab facilities, and visits to the house. A little over 4 years ago – after my Mom passed – Greg and Linda Krinks (and probably others) made the effort to visit my Dad regularly and study the Bible with him which ultimately resulted in my Dad's baptism on January 1, 2015 at 87 years old. From the first Sunday my Dad started visiting, the entire congregation welcomed him warmly into the church family - talking with him, breaking bread with him, shaking his hand, and just looking out for him. Many of you have shared what an encouragement his attendance and his smile was to you, but words cannot express what you all meant to him and how you and your love positively impacted the quality of his life over the last few years as his health declined. You made his life special again after losing his connection to many people during my Mom's journey with Alzheimer's. My Dad's time with this congregation is a testament to the fact that the most important gift is love and that you can impact someone beyond measure simply by saying hello and shaking someone's hand or giving them a hug. Thank you for being servants to my Dad and to our family.
