

Dwight Thompson!

In the last fifty years, I know of no man who has had a greater impact on the kingdom of God in general, on the Churches of Christ in the Philadelphia area, and on South Jersey in particular, than did Dwight Thompson!

Dwight first served our church as an active and dedicated member. In 1975 he was appointed as a deacon, and in January 1991 he was ordained as an elder. Dwight has served as an elder for twenty-eight years, making him the longest serving elder in the history of the Pitman Road Church of Christ.

Known far and wide, Dwight was a thoughtful, tender, servant-hearted, compassionate, and dedicated teacher. He was a man of passion, with both integrity and character, as he influenced kids in public schools. For decades as a health and physical education teacher, a driver's educational instructor, and a baseball coach, his life impacted both students and other faculty members.

Even while Dwight and Mary Lea ministered in South Jersey, he served on the president's board at Harding University in Searcy, Arkansas. Dwight has been instrumental in helping many young adults attend this Christian university.

For over 50 years, the life, hospitality, and ministry of Dwight and Mary Lea impacted countless thousands (and that is not an exaggeration). Talk about letting your lights shine, and not hiding your light under a basket! Dwight and Mary Lea are the personification of that Bible verse.

Dwight and Mary Lea first impacted Katherine and me in July 1973 before they even met us. They allowed us to live in their home for three weeks while they were away on vacation. They had never met us, but they knew we were Christians, they knew we were Harding graduates, and they knew that we were moving to New Jersey to help plant a new church. So that qualified us to take their house keys and move into their house. There was no background check, no security check, just unconditional Christian love!

I also happen to know that they were consistently among the most generous— even sacrificial—givers, both in weekly contributions, and in nearly every special need that came down the pike. And that continued even until last week when Mary Lea handed me a generous check to help one of our young adults going on a mission trip.

From the Captain's Desk

Two weeks ago, I had the honor of leading the Hammonton LIFE Group. Along with Derrick's lesson and Andy's handout, I had some good material. We talked about Paul being in jail and what he had been going through, and how he had advanced God's mission through the story of his life. After reading through Andy's material and hearing Derrick speak, another thought occurred to me. I thought about Winterfest 2019. You may ask, what does one have to do with the other? Well, I will tell you. It has to do with two words – *OUR STORY*. Yes, we all have a story to tell, but the question is, does that story include God? How is our story advancing God's mission? (Think about some of the stories in our own church: The Thompsons, The Coopers, and others who choose to live out their stories here in NJ.) Paul affected many people while in prison with his nonstop preaching. Paul used his story and his circumstances to advance God's mission.

This year at Winterfest (one of my favorite trips), we talked about *our story*. We talked about how we can use our story to affect people we meet every day. The key to our story is that God must be in it. We challenged the kids to journal every day, then to look back to see where God was and where God wasn't in their lives. It was evident in Paul's life where God was, and you can see that in his story.

What is the purpose of your story? Is it to just go through life and live, or do you have a mission to complete? Our purpose is to get to eternity (Ecclesiastes 3:11) and to bring as many people with us as we can (Matthew. 28:19).


