
From Daniel's Den

Repeat after me: "Hello Minister!"

Yep! Ready or not, you are a minster. God called you to be a minister. God has called our church leaders to train you to be an effective minister. This coming Sunday, Dan will conclude Part 2 of his two part series, "Make Me a Servant, Lord, Make Me Like You."

Did you know that the primary word for "minister," "servant," and "deacon" in the New Testament are all the same word? It is true! The Greek word most commonly used for all three of these English words is DIAKONOS. Context alone determines the way the word, DIAKONOS, should be translated. That challenging passage in Ephesians 4:11-13 that describes what church leaders are to do for the church members says that church leaders are to equip church members "for works of service," or works of "ministry," or for "DIAKONOS." Briefly stated, my calling as an "evangelist" is to equip you to be a DIAKONOS, or servant or minister. "Hello minister!"

Do not read too much into this next statement because I am not quitting. I am semi-retiring. I still have lots of work to do and I am eagerly anticipating the next phase of my life. I am inviting all members, all former members, and all of my friends to be present two weeks from today, June 9, when I preach **"My Final Sermon as a Full Time Minister!"** Would you honor me with your presence? I will accept your presence on June 9th as a great gift. I have a message on my heart for you. And, it is a message that will look both backwards and forwards. God is in this, and of that I have no doubt!
