#### The Opposition

When did you last face opposition?

When we first introduced Munchkin Ministry at this church, we initially faced opposition. When we introduced the idea of Wednesday night meals, we faced opposition. When we moved to a LIFE Group format on Sunday nights rather than a traditional Sunday night church, believe me when I say, we faced opposition. And, did we face any opposition when we set about moving out of our old building and building a new building? To ask that question is to answer it! YES.

Were you trying to introduce a new menu item to your family's diet? Opposition! Were you trying to introduce a new way of doing things at work? Opposition! Or, were you trying to introduce a new program at church? Opposition! Whatever you have tried to start, you faced opposition. People do not easily take to change, even when change is for the better. Nehemiah's day was no exception.

When Sanballat heard about the rebuilding of the wall around Jerusalem, "he became furious and very angry and mocked the Jews" (Neh. 4:1). He resorted to sarcasm and insult in his efforts to discourage a good work (Neh. 4:2). Later, he conspired with others to create a disturbance" (4:8). Threats and bullying also followed (4:11).

If we are attempting to build or bring about any change, we will face opposition! The solution? Be prepared. Be prepared for opposition! Work and Pray (4:9). Setting about to do something good? Be prepared and willing to take drastic measures, then stay with it till the job is done (4:23).

Working to do something really great? Be prepared to take three steps forward and two steps backwards.

### You can call me Greg...

"You can call me Greg, Dr. Greg, Gregory, or even John, but don't call me late for dinner!" You've probably heard that line at some time from family or friends. I first heard it as a child – it was cute and it spoke to me: As long as you love me and care for me (by feeding me on time!) I won't get hung up about the way you address me. But what about the way my Lord addresses me? What might He call me – or us? He knows the number of hairs on our heads, our thoughts before they become words, and certainly our names! Yet He calls us by other names as well.

In the book of Isaiah, God, through the prophet, calls His people by a variety of "names" having to do with their attributes, accomplishments, and faith in Him. Isaiah says: You will be called-"City of Righteousness", "Faithful City" (1:26); "Repairer of Broken Walls, Restorer of Streets with Dwellings" (58:12); "oaks of righteousness", "priests of the Lord" (61:3, 6); "the Holy People", "Redeemed of the Lord", "Sought After", "the City No Longer Deserted" (62:12).

What a glorious thought – to be greeted by name on that day as a "good and faithful servant" and be called... Builder of Relationships, Servant of All, Sharer of Good News, Protector of Children, Lover of the Least of These, Preserver of Marriage, Tireless Peacemaker, Healer of Broken People, Forgiver of All, Visitor of the Sick... undoubtedly you can think of many others, especially ones that may apply uniquely to you. May we as God's children be called all of these things and even more on that day!

Please RSVP to Dan @ dcooper@coChrist.org NOW, or by Feb. 22nd at the latest, so that appropriate plans for the meal can be made.




#### JERUSALEM VIA IMAX

payment to Dan or Dottie. We will likely grab a bite of lunch on the way to Philadelphia, so come prepared to buy lunch on your own. More details next week!




