

#### **Lessons from an Old Guy!**

Last weekend I attended the 8<sup>th</sup> annual New England Church Growth Conference! In case you weren't aware, I spent seven of my growing up years as a "Green Mountain Boy." Springfield, Vermont was my home town through all of Jr. High, Sr. High and my first year of college. I feel like a New Englander, and love connecting with my church family in that "neck of the woods" (to use one of their phrases). This year Dr. Howard Norton was their keynote speakers at the conference.

Dr. Norton is getting up there in age. I don't know exactly how old he is; but he's done a lot in his life. Dr. Norton has ministered around the world, served as an editor for The Christian Chronicle, a full time minister, a missionary to Sao Paolo, Brazil, and a full time instructor at both Oklahoma Christian University and Harding University. One of his lectures at the conference included suggestions on developing "an action plan for your local church." He used the Apostle Paul as an example of a man with a plan (See Romans 15:19-ff).

Dr Norton listed five suggestions on developing an action plan for church!

- 1. Study biblical vision and methods.
- 2. Look for opportunities near you.
- 3. Use the talents and passions of your members.
- 4. Lead the church in goal setting.
- 5. Develop a time table.

### **Serving Our Seniors**

The ministry at Parke Place was inspired by visits with my great-aunt Nancy there, shortly after it opened. She complained that a priest only came once each month. At that time, our congregation was just around the corner in our old building, so it was very convenient to start this ministry for those who were shut it.

More than a dozen years later, some of our members still meet at Parke Place weekly, during the 9:00 AM Bible class hour. We conduct a worship service, including prayer, singing, a short sermon, and the Lord's Supper. With the exception of Beverly Steiner, who serves each week, most members participate for a quarter at a time. The Brittons also consistently participate while they are home April through December. About 50 of our men have preached at Parke Place. Doc Kistler and Bill Stokes enjoyed speaking weekly. This is a good place for men to get a start at preaching or song leading.

Attendance by residents varies, usually from two to six people. Most residents living at Parke Place are not able to attend church Sunday mornings. When my wife, Sue, was living, she couldn't imagine being isolated from our Pitman church family, so our intention was to be a church family to those at Parke Place.

We would like to have you come and join us any Sunday, whether you attend for only one service, or make a commitment and attend for a full quarter. It's great that some people come to visit us at our building, but many people need an introduction to Jesus family outside the building. This is one attempt to, "Go into all the world..." If you are interested, contact me. We meet at 8:40 AM on Sunday mornings at the church building to drive over to Parke Place.

As deacon to senior saints, I would like to commend the many people who faithfully carryout the Bible's mandate to take care of your parents. I would also like to thank the those who also take care of non-relatives in need by offering food, clothing, rides, invitations to dinner and outings, medical care, legal assistance, connecting by phone and digital devices, sharing the Lord's supper, praying for each other... You are the hands and feet of Jesus.


