God's Indispensable Gift

Motherhood is one of God's greatest gifts to humanity. A loving, committed mother is indispensable in our development. Mothers instill powerful social and nurturing characteristics in each generation. It is principally from their mothers that children learn the virtues of sacrifice, sharing, valuing others, compassion, community and a host of other values and skills.

Biologically, women are designed for self-sacrifice. When pregnant, a woman's body focuses its primary attention to nurturing the growing life developing within her, prioritizing the needs of her unborn baby. After her children are born, a mother will continue to sacrifice herself for the needs of her children.



God designed mothers to nurture. There is no greater nurturing

power on the planet than a mother. When the apostle Paul described his love for the church at Thessalonica, he used the metaphor of a mother's love to describe how deeply he cared for the Thessalonians. He reminded them that he was like a "gentle" mother who "tenderly cares for her own children" (1 Thessalonians 2:7). When God described His love for Israel, He did so with a motherhood metaphor. He told Israel that He would comfort them like a mother comforts her children (Isaiah 66:13).

The book of Proverbs closes with a great tribute to women. It speaks of the beautiful, indispensable role that women play in God's creation. After 30 chapters of directions on living a good, godly, noble life, Proverbs closes with these words to the godly woman: "Her children rise up and bless her; her husband also, and he praises her, saying, 'Many daughters have done nobly, But you excel them all.' Charm is deceitful and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the Lord, she shall be praised. Give her the product of her hands, and let her works praise her in the gates" (Proverbs 31:28-31).

The best of all that God designed a woman to be is expressed in motherhood. Motherhood, at its roots, is a conscious, deliberate decision by a woman to enter into that noble, God-like act of loving self-sacrifice to participate with the God of all creation to bring a new life into the world.

This Mother's Day, I hope you will take the time to say thanks to your mother in a special way. No, she isn't perfect, and no, she didn't do everything right, but she gave you life.

And to mothers, I say thank you for all you have done to prepare your children to be the good men and women of the next generation. Our world cannot make it without you. Thank you for all you do. Happy Mother's Day.

This edition of *Mission Marseille* features a "mission report" written by **Katherine Finn**, daughter of **Mark and Becky Finn** (the long time ministers of the Collingswood Church of Christ), about her mission work in Marseille, France. It's packed full of fascinating details outlining her numerous activities since she arrived in Marseille last February.

Katherine is training to become a certified camp counselor at **Centre Bonnefoi**. She just completed the Advanced Bible Study Series for European missionaries. She has helped to coordinate a Sweetheart Dinner for thirteen couples from the church and from their local community. She is helping to organize the offices and many ministries of the local church in Marseille. She is teaching English classes, helping to lead an afterschool program, and helping to produce their semi-annual play. On the day of their play they were shocked to have 100 visitors present for the program. Katherine is also a member of **Chorale Harmonie**, their singing group that performs both in their local community, and in venues throughout Europe.

I share this information because Katherine was first introduced to the work in Marseille on a mission trip she took with our church on our short term mission trip in 2009. She heard the call of the "great commission" (Matt. 28:18-20) in 2009, and that call has called her back to France repeatedly. Our France Mission Team will connect with Katherine this June, God willing.

In the original write up we noted that Tracy had just recently completed her MBA. We now also want to congratulate William for completing his MBA program as well!


Monday Night Thanks

New Members


