Happy Memorial Day!



"The official start to summer!" How many times have you heard that this past week? Tradition has become that the summer season begins on Memorial Day weekend, but that was not the intended purpose for the day. And even though we often recognize all our veterans on Memorial Day, it was created to specifically honor those who sacrificed their lives in American wars. Originally called Decoration Day (inspired by the southern tradition of decorating graves with garlands and wreaths of flowers), its purpose was to commemorate Union soldiers who died in the Civil War. In 1868 it was established as a national day of remembrance of all who died in the military service during the Civil

War, both Union and Confederacy, and observed on May 30th, regardless of what day of the week it fell on. Southern states were resistant to celebrate Decoration Day because of its Union origins, and honored their war dead on another day. After World War I, the observance was renamed Memorial Day and expanded to include all who died in American Wars, becoming more nationally celebrated. After the Uniform Monday Holiday act was passed, Memorial Day was established in 1971 as a Federal holiday, and celebrated on the last Monday in May.

Whether you are enjoying a barbeque, the beach, or the shopping mall, take a moment to remember those who sacrificed everything for the freedom that we all enjoy! "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." John 15:13


Special Collection

Nepal Disaster Relief Efforts

As you have undoubtedly heard, Nepal was hit by a 7.8 earthquake on April 25th and then another on May 12th measuring 7.3. There have been over 200 aftershocks since. Many have lost their homes and loved ones. As a matter of fact, Nepal's Home Ministry confirmed over 8,000 deaths thus far, making it their worst national disaster ever.

Our elders have designated two special collection Sundays, today and next Sunday (May 24 & 31) to give our members and our community an opportunity to contribute to the relief efforts in Nepal. The designated contributions will be sent to Samaritan's Purse, a well-known and respected Christian relief organization that was already on the ground in Nepal when the first quake hit and able to immediately begin aid. The funds we send will be used to furnish medical supplies, water, food, blankets, shelter, and sanitation.

In addition to the above contributions, as the deacon over our Caring and Sharing Ministry, I am designating a donation of \$5 for every senior from Pitman High School who attends the Baccalaureate Service on June 7th from the Caring and Sharing Ministry budget. If all 100 seniors attend this service, that would be another \$500 to help with the relief efforts.
