Heartfelt Thanks

Dear Church Family.

I am sure that you have heard about the unfortunate car accident that happened to Jee and I on June 18. I just wanted to take a moment to let you know what happened that REALLY mattered on that day.

Jee and I were truly blessed by the love of Jesus Christ as we came face to face with death. God intervened on our behalf by navigating our car into a clear path and bringing the car to a complete stop inches before we fell into a ditch. He did all of this with an 18-wheeler tractor trailer attached and sitting on our backs (literally)!!!

By the grace of God, Jee was flown to Johns Hopkins, the hospital that is ranked third in the country for spinal cord rehabilitation. Jee had suffered a completely severed spine. At that time we didn't know that she had such a severe injury. She laid under God's watchful eye in the Pediatric ICU for over a week. The doctors were not sure if she would live. She endured a 7 1/2 hour surgery with three teams of doctors to try to piece her spine back together. The doctors informed us that they tried their best to salvage her spinal cord but it was too damaged. They gave us the news that she would never walk again and would have a very long road





of recovery ahead of her. She was paralyzed from underneath of her breast bone to the tip of her toes for life. Accepting that prognosis was painful, but all I could keep thinking about was how God had spared our lives and that He would surely continue to see us through.


But God!

Think with me about life's unexpected storms, stressors, peaks and valleys, and even the unexpected shark attacks that in our most diligent preparation and due diligence, they catch us off guard! To say that life can be overwhelming at times, would be a gross understatement. There seems to be this constant struggle and pull in each of us, at our very core, that demands the successful fulfillment of our plans, driven by the notion that we know best. Perhaps it can be simply tagged as, "Our Plans vs Reality." Does this picture resonate mentally?

As we think about life together, I want these two powerful words to become deeply rooted in our hearts, "<u>But God</u>!" As I think about these two words, my heart turns to **Romans** 8:28, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his

purpose." Have you ever sat and thought about decisions that you've made that you would characterize as prayerful and approached with much counsel, yet you did not get *your* desired end? "*But God!*" Have you been praying for a child or loved one that appears to be far from the Lord? Even reading this article may be causing that very familiar uprising of hopelessness or even anger as you continue to wonder if you will ever see them walking with the Lord. "*But God!*" Perhaps you've made a decision, or a series of decisions, that you deeply regret, and now have to endure the painful outcome of walking through those decisions. "*But God!*" God is there for you!

Note the top 10 stressors for adults, young adults and kids. **Adult stressors**: death of a spouse (or child*), divorce, marital separation, imprisonment, death of a close family member, personal injury or illness, marriage, dismissal from work, marital reconciliation and retirement. **Young adult stressors**: money, the future, appearance, weight, health, getting a job, getting into a chosen career, finding a job which pays enough money, the health of a loved one, and meeting a partner. **Child and teen stressors**:

parent having problems, fight with a friend or sibling(s), taking a test, wondering if someone thinks you're attractive (teens especially), not having enough privacy, birth of a brother or sister, moving to a new school, re/marriage of a parent, not having enough money, and finally, having a teacher that doesn't like you. Are you exhausted? When we accept at a heart level the words, "<u>But God</u>," we are encouraging a heart turn towards the sovereignty and control of God in **EVERYTHING!**

Let's encourage one another and ourselves by meditating deeply on the "<u>But God</u>" passages: Genesis 8:1, Genesis 31:42, Genesis 50:20, 1 Samuel 23:14, 1 Kings 5:4, Nehemiah 9:17, Psalm 49:15, Psalm 73:26, Isaiah 40:8, Jonah 2:6, Matthew 19:26, John 1:18, Acts 2:24, Acts 3:15, Acts 5:39, Romans 5:8, Romans 6:23, Romans 8:9, 1Corinthians 1:27, 2 Timothy 2:9. -Derrick

prayers, well wishes, love, and kind thoughts have brought us thus far. Jee is now in an extensive rehab program. She is able to sit up without any support, take off her shoes, brush her hair, pick up small items off of the floor, move herself manually from one place to another using her arms, putting on her own shirt, graduating to a manual wheelchair from and electric wheelchair, playing basketball and hide and seek, and enjoying many other activities that she enjoyed before the accident. All of this she has accomplished within a four week time frame. Most importantly, she has embraced her change in lifestyle with a beautiful smile everyday, and a heart that thanks God for protecting us and giving us an opportunity to live to see another day. She thanks God for injuring her and not me because I wouldn't have survived. She prays for the family of the other 14 year old girl that lost her life in the same accident, and she prays for the truck driver that hit us. She asked that we forgive him because God would want us to.

During this time, I have been unable to work and have been struggling financially to keep everything in tact until we get home. I have put my complete trust in the Lord and He continues to shine through. Dan helped me set up a PayPal account for the last few weeks because he said he wanted to be able to send me money to help. I finally got the account set up and today I got a

notification that there is a large deposit made to this account from my church family with a message that says to "Never forget that you are loved."

My heart is smiling and tears of joy flood my eyes as I humbly say "Thank you from the bottom of my heart." This money is very much needed and will help pay important bills. Please know that you all are loved and appreciated. We can't wait to get home so that we can celebrate life and the goodness of the Lord with our church family who has held us up in so many
