A PEACHER'S PERSPECTIVE

We are not promised or guaranteed physical safety. John's gospel records some of Jesus's final words. Arguably, these words are the most important things Jesus wanted his followers to remember. He mentions peace of mind and heart (Jn 14:27), being filled with joy (Jn 15:11), and the help of the Holy Spirit (Jn 16), but not once does Jesus guarantee security for our bodies. He does promise there will be trouble in this life (16:33). Yet, as fleshly people, we tend to focus on our physical security.

We must make paramount the entire human being. We are more than flesh and bones. We are spirits and souls. We are a complex mixture of mind (mental), soul (spiritual), heart (emotional), and strength (bodily). Jesus alluded to this when he told us to love God in all those ways. When I read of missionaries and martyrs in history and in the events of Scripture, I read very little concern for physical safety. In fact, just the opposite happens in most cases. People on fire for God run towards possible bodily harm while declaring their spirits completely at peace. I have felt at times that decisions, at many different levels, have weighted the physical health much heavier than the rest of our health.

We live in fear instead of faith. Our hearts are wicked and deceitful. (Jer 17:9) We rot on the inside. Emotional exhaustion and mental trauma weigh us down. Yet, God gives us heart transplants. His primary concern is for our spirits and our souls. When our hearts are focused on the sacrifice of Jesus, burdens of this world are lifted. When we join to declare faith over fear, to declare our potentially eternal souls are more important than our temporary bodies, we perform an essential function for ourselves as human beings. We give our spirits what they need to remain strong and healthy when we worship God in community.

Life is full of risk and danger in a cursed world. We will lose. We will fail. We will suffer. We will die. The Christian transformative journey is not a straight, joyful line up the ladder to heaven, but a series of dips, curves, ascents, pauses and restarts. We are not the first generation of Americans or Christians to face challenging times, and we will not be the last. Past leaders, who faced and overcame extraordinary times, challenge, comfort and strengthen me. Reflect on their words and remember: this time too will pass.




Steve McBride will be officially finished with his E. R. Residency Program at the end of June. He begins a new job in Indianapolis on July 1. Way to go, Steve!
