Shepherd's Voice

Our Father

"This, then is how you should pray." Matt. 7: 9-13

The disciples came to Jesus asking Him to teach them how to pray. It was not as if they were unfamiliar with prayer. This practice was certainly a part of their religious upbringing. Yet they saw something in Jesus that they lacked. So one of them asked, "Lord teach us to pray." Jesus gave His disciples a very simple and concise prayer to help them.

He taught them regarding their position in prayer, "Our Father in heaven, holy is your name." Prayer orients us in relation to Him. He is our Father in heaven, a holy and transcendent God who is worthy of our prayers. In this way we acknowledge our dependence on Him as our Father. He is not a reluctant hearer, but a willing listener who seeks us as we come before Him with our thoughts and desires.

Concerning our desires, Jesus taught his disciples what we should desire, and how to express that in prayer. "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." In prayer, we learn to want what the Father wants. We pray that we might learn to want the true reality of heaven present here on earth. The world around us clamors for our attention and for our desires. There is so much to want in this world, yet, in prayer we discern the things of greater importance.

In this prayer, Jesus teaches the disciples to depend on His provision and grace for their lives. "Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors." God's blessings sustain us in life. He gives us what we need for real physical and spiritual growth. In prayer, we accept the mercy that we have received from God and we understand that His mercy is to be extended to others, to our brothers and sisters, through us.

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." Prayer teaches us that we are not alone. God protects us from the evil one. Satan has already lost. In prayer, we learn that in the battle of good and evil, God comes along side of those who trust in Him and learn from Him in prayer.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer said, "A Christian fellowship lives and exists by the intercession of its members for one another, or it collapses." May we be inspired by the spirit of Christ to give ourselves to one another and to the world in the work of prayer.

Jr. Worship


