## From Daniel's Den


#### "They Turned the World Upside Down!"

What an accusation...or compliment! Paul and Silas were in the ancient city of Thessalonica and they caused a huge stir! (See Acts 17:1-9). To put this matter into everyday language, they caused a riot! What caused the riot? They declared "it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead." It was counterintuitive. It was countercultural! Wisdom of the day calculated that the Messiah should be crowned as the king, but this Messiah suffered and was killed. Paul and Silas went on to say, "This Jesus, whom I proclaim to you, is the Christ."

So, what was the response to their message? Some were "jealous" of the influence that Paul and Silas had and caused an "uproar!" But, many others were persuaded that Christ was the Messiah, including "a great number of the devout Greeks and not a few of the leading women." The spirit filled words of Paul and Silas led to this accusation: "These men who have turned the world upside down have come here also..." They were an unstoppable force for Christ!

Ultimately, Paul and Silas escaped the city under the cover of darkness! (Acts 17:10-15) But, their narrow escape did not stop them from sharing. They simply went to the next city, Athens, and there they boldly proclaimed the truth about the "unknown God" (Acts 17:22). They were unstoppable!

That accusation, that they turned the world upside down...well, this is my proposal...in reality... they turned the world right side up! And that is what the church is really about...the church is designed by God to make things right. We are ministers of reconciliation. We help people experience, know and share God's love. We meet others where they are, and together, we are transformed into the image of Christ.

# Shepherd's Voice

### **Transform: Choose Encouragement**

How could Chuck Swindoll know exactly what I was feeling? The message on my car radio hit close to home. Pressures at work, changes at church, children at college, loved ones hurting, another New Year's resolution. I was discouraged. And there was a message I needed to hear.

Nehemiah chapter 4 tells of a people growing tired of their project and getting discouraged. If not addressed, discouragement is contagious. Ouch! I reflected long on that statement. I thought, "Lord, I don't want to be discouraged. I don't want to be a discourager. Help me!"

A lesson on the causes and cures for discouragement followed. Causes: loss of energy, being overworked; loss of vision, focusing on messy distractions; loss of confidence, feeling not capable; loss of heart, losing motivation; loss of security, being scared. *What a list!* That combination could discourage almost anyone.

But there was good news. Discouragement *can be* fixed. Cures: rest, spend time with family; direct attention to the Lord and His greatness, not the mess; maintain a balance, best accomplished when we each do our part; look for a rallying point with others; hang and partner with encouragers; serve, get involved in the lives of others. *What a list!* This combination could *encourage* almost anyone.

After this lesson I thought, "God knows just what I need and when I need it" and, "Which of those lists above is me?" That was the struggle for the Jews rebuilding the wall, and it is our struggle to-day. Alone, I fall into that first list. Walking with the Spirit, and this church family, I grab hold of the second. It's not by chance that our mission statement includes "...and together, be transformed..."

"God, help me live a life consistent with Philippians 4:4-8, 1 Thessalonians 5:11 and Hebrews 3:13. Help me to choose encouragement."


# New Logo Shirts

They also have the only center in Bolivia that provides free legal, social, and psychological services to child victims of sexual violence. The center was started by Eastern graduate, Brisa De Angulo, and has offered free services to over 1,200 children and their families. MAP International takes a holistic approach to community development, especially early childhood development, and has been working in Bolivia for over 25 years to bring hope and health to oppressed communities.

This year, each of us needs to raise \$1,900 to go on the trip.
