

### Update on Glynn

Glynn & Debby Durham met with an oncologist this past Wednesday to discuss the next step in Glynn's treatment for stomach cancer. Presently, the plan is to treat Glynn with aggressive chemotherapy to put the cancer into remission. He will undergo additional testing within the next 2 weeks to determine the specific course of chemo. Because Glynn's overall health is strong, and depending on the level of the tumor "HER" marker, the hope is that he can be treated with mega doses of chemo drugs in a combination of infusion and oral chemotherapy. Glynn is eating well, is under no dietary restrictions, and his activity level will be at whatever pace is comfortable to him. (With oversight from Debby!)

Please continue to pray fervently for Glynn and Debby. They can use all of our encouragement, positive thoughts, and messages! Glynn enjoys phone calls, texts, cards, and planned visits.
