


Celebrate Mom! Celebrate Families!

The Elder's Wife

My file folder on "Elders" is two inches thick. In addition to the Bible, I've spent a lot of time in that big, thick, folder in recent weeks. And, I found only two articles on elders' wives. You already know that each elder can have one wife (1 Tim. 3:2), so that is not the point.

The elder's wife is vital to the smooth operation of the Lord's church. She is a devoted person who holds no official title. Yet, she holds the power to disrupt or expedite the most important works of the church. Elders' wives come in a variety of shapes, sizes, colors, ages and textures. And there is not one "perfect" elder's wife.

She knows the loneliness of waiting up for her husband late on Wednesday nights, while he is at an elders' meeting. She is, or she becomes, competent to counsel those facing difficulty.

Someone has said, "An elder's wife must be staunch as a rock, as tender as a mother hen, as busy as a beaver, and as quiet as a mouse." If I read 1 Timothy 3:11 correctly, an elders' wives must also be "dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded and faithful in all things." An elder's wife plays a vital role in helping him to be hospitable, manage the household well, keep their children under control, and have a good reputation outside the church (1 Tim. 3:2-7).

I thank God for our current elders' wives! I love, honor and respect them deeply. As you list your nominations for our new elders, do not overlook the crucial role that the potential elder's wife will play in her husband's ability to shepherd this flock.
