# From Daniel's Den

## "JEFF WE WILL NOT FORGET YOU"



Katherine and I recently visited the Freedom Tower (a.k.a. One World Trade Center), the Reflecting Pools, and the 9/11 Museum. All three are on the site of what was the original World Trade Center, known as "Ground Zero" after the 9/11 attacks. I strongly encourage you to take a full day in New York City to visit these sites. A stop to visit St. Paul's Chapel is worth your time, too. Those who worked diligently to put together the memorial did an exceptional job.

For us, it was an extremely moving day. Katherine spent a good part of the day wiping tears from her eyes. For me, while I cried only once, the entire day was a deeply touching, even spiritual, experience. The most touching moment for me was reading the message inscribed on the ruins of Ladder Co. 3, "Jeff, we will not forget you!" This was Jeff's ladder truck, and he was killed on 9/11. Those words were inscribed by fellow firefighters in the days following the collapse of the World Trade Center.

Every Sunday when we gather around the Lord's Table, we are basically saying, "Jesus, we will not forget you." As we take the bread we say, "Jesus, we will not forget you." And as we take the cup, we drink saying, "Jesus, we will not forget you." Jesus said, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. ### 2017 France Mission Trip Informational Meeting

#### If you would like to learn more about our next mission trip to France, you need to plan to attend our informational meeting at our church building THIS Wednesday, September 14th at 7:00 pm in Classroom B-4.

Over the last ten years, a total of 50 people have partnered with us on the France mission trips. Some have made only one trip, others have made two trips, and still others have made 3, 4, or all 5 of our biannual trips. Over the years, a huge amount of work has been done, and we are continuing to make progress on a number of projects, and to attack new projects, as well! Some jobs are repeated every year...like cleaning and organizing the craft room. Many hands are needed...young or old, skilled or unskilled, experienced or inexperienced.

If you'd like to know more specifics, you need to attend this informational meeting from 7:00 to 7:55 on Wednesday. What we know right now: The dates for the coming trip will be June 25-July 2, 2017. The cost will be approximately \$2,200 per person. We will only be taking 25 workers, and 10 are already registered. A \$200 fully refundable deposit will hold a spot for you. No person has ever been prevented from going because of a lack of financial support. You do need a passport if you intend to go.
