

Should one begin new traditions? "Hope for the Holidays" is a seminar designed to help those who are dealing with grief and loss to prepare for the approaching holidays.

The seminar speakers will be **Glynn Durham**, the visitation minister at the Pitman Road Church of Christ, (and also a former hospice chaplain,) and his wife, **Debby Durham**. As part of the seminar Glynn will share a message, "How to Keep Your Loved One Close During the Holidays." Debby, who had two children in college and a third in high school when her husband died, will share her story of making new holiday traditions with her children.

About the Durhams

Glynn and Debby Durham have a unique story. Glynn married his college sweetheart, Susan, and became a minister. Early in his ministry, he performed a wedding ceremony for a young couple, Gary and Debby Thies. The two couples had remained friends through the years. Glynn lost his wife, Susan, to cancer in February, 2006. Debby lost her husband, Gary, suddenly, two months prior, in December, 2005. Glynn and Debby began corresponding to support each other in their grief, and love followed. They were married in August of 2008.
