Hope for the Holidays

I understand the pain of losing a loved one. I remember wondering how I could go on without my wife of 35 years in my life. My grief was raw. It was intense. The tears flowed at the mention of her name. I couldn't help it. The pain was awful.

I knew I needed help in dealing with the pain of my grief. I was not making much headway on my own. At times it seemed like it was getting worse instead of better. But I didn't know how to go about finding that help. Should I seek out grief counseling? Would joining a support group help me deal with my grief?

I understand the tendency to try to run away from or avoid dealing with grief. We try to convince ourselves that we are going to do better, to be better. We acknowledge that "dealing with our stuff" will not come without some pain of its own. So we continue to wait and avoid dealing with it.

Eight months after Susan's death I attended a grief seminar entitled *Hope for the Holidays*. I am sure it was designed especially for me. It met me where I was on my grief journey, and it gave me some strategies to help me to deal with the holidays. This seminar may have saved my life. I know it was a blessing.

Three weeks from now my wife Debby and I will offer our version of *Hope for the Holidays*. If you have lost a loved one to death within the last year or two, I hope you will plan to attend. We will both speak from having lost our spouse several years ago. We will share how to have hope for the holidays. In addition, I will share a lesson on "How to Keep Your Loved One Close During the Holidays."

Maybe you know someone who needs to attend this seminar. It will be held here, in the Chapel, on Saturday, November 5, at 9:30 am to 12:00 noon.


The Church That's Known for It's Prayer
