It was August, 1971. Anne read in the newspaper that college student were going through Pitman inviting people to church and setting up home Bible Studies. She saw them coming down the other side of the street and waited for them to make it to her side of the street. They came to her house. As they knocked on her door she greeted them and invited them into her home.

She accepted their invitation to study the Bible with her, and she met Paul Cantrell and other members of the Pitman Church of Christ, which was meeting on E. Holly Avenue at the time. She was baptized into Christ, and eventually led her husband, Frank, to an understanding of who Jesus was and how Jesus wanted Frank to respond. He was baptized into Christ during a meeting when Jimmy Allen was preaching. Frank responded to the gospel at 80 years of age!

Since those early days, Anne has been a consistent and predictable regular. As predictable as clock work! If it needed to be done,

Anne would be a part of the plan to get it done. She has been a member of our church for over 45 years! Amazing! She loves people. She loves the church. She loves Jesus. She loves sharing her faith.

But, the aging process and ongoing health concerns have made is necessary for Anne to move into assisted living in the Newark, DE area, near her daughter, Toni Harlan. Anne had her personal belongings moved out of her condo in Pitman this past Thursday, and she is preparing to sell it. 
So, when you die, "at your funeral," or even if you avoid the funeral, how will you be remembered?

THE PAJAMA DRIVE HAS BEEN EXTENDED!


The teens want to do even more good for area children. And we can help


Bread of Life Ministry
