A Great Gift from God to Man - The Bible: Some Interesting Facts About/From the Bible

- The most shoplifted book in the world is the Bible.
- In 2011, British calligrapher Donald Jackson and a team of calligraphers completed what is believed to the first handwritten Bible with illustrations since the invention of the printing press. It took 12 years to complete and cost \$8 million.
- Jesus had four brothers and several unnamed sisters (Mathew 13:5).
- There is no physical description of Jesus in the Bible. None!
- Thomas Jefferson made his own Bible out of scrapes from the New Testament in order to focus on the moral teachings of Jesus of Nazareth instead of impossibilities like the miracles.
- Hell in modern Bible translations refers to "Gehenna," an actual place outside Jerusalem where they burned garbage and thus there was always a fire burning. The bodies of those deemed to have died in sin without hope were thrown there to be destroyed.
- There is an organization that illegally parachutes copies of the Bible into North Korea.
- The Bible is actually a compilation of 66 books written over a period of about 1,400 years by about 40 authors.

We need to remember that visiting a church for the first time can be an intimidating experience.

Be Our Guest!

My ministry area coordinates greeters to meet our visitors and contact them after their visit through the ReachOut ministry. This ministry exists to help us fulfill the Great Commission in our own local communities. Local Evangelism is an area of critical importance for the growth of our congregation, the maturity of our members, and the wellbeing of the souls all around us. We need to remember that visiting a church for the first time can be an intimidating experience. We all have been there at least once. People frequently visit a church for the first time during a period of stress or change in their lives. We want to be responsive to their needs and make their initial visit with us a meaningful one.

Greeters Ministry: We coordinate the greeters for both the front and rear main entrances for Sunday morning services. The schedule for greeters starts prior to the start of Bible class and at the beginning of worship service. Greeters are asked to greet everyone and distribute bulletins to everyone who enters. Of utmost importance, greeters are to hand out a guest folder to every first time guest and encourage them to fill out the "Connection Card" and then place it into the collection basket or drop it off at the Welcome Center.

ReachOut Ministry: This ministry was created to coordinate church members with our visitors after their initial visit to our church service. On Sunday or Monday, an email is sent the ReachOut team members to provide their ReachOut assignments. The email explains to the ReachOut team members of their assignment which could be contact the visitors through emails, note (sent through the mail), phone calls, or visits. Most importantly, we offer prayers for our visitors. I believe that these are important ministries because so many churches miss opportunity to grow their church simply because they didn't know the visitor(s) were there. I believe that every person that walks through our doors should be welcomed and then contacted after their visit.
