Lust...

Yep, that one word caught your attention! And how about this for a sermon topic... *God Made Sex Really Good*. When did you last hear a sermon about sex? It's in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5:27-32). Jesus said, "You shall not commit adultery." Jesus went on by warning men not even to look upon women with lustful intent. It is time to re-think sexuality! Sex is good in marriage, but using our sexuality selfishly is lustful and wrong. Don't do it! How many abortions would have been averted were sexuality enjoyed exclusively as God designed?

"In scripture, sex and sin are far from the same thing," asserts Randy Harris. Harris goes on to say, "From the story of creation all the way to the hot, erotic, poetry of the Song of Solomon, sexuality is created by God who looks at it, and declares it to be good." But, Harris continues, in our culture, not only has sex "gone wrong, it has gone badly wrong!" ... "The deep sin attached to lust and pornography is that you use another person as simply an object of your desires. It's the ultimate self-centered act." (*Living Jesus: Doing What Jesus Says in the Sermon on the Mount*)

What is at the heart of lust, adultery and sexual sin/pornography, is always selfishness! What is at the heart of sexual sin is our own gratification, rather than caring about the other person as a person. It is time for followers of Jesus to "Re-think" sexuality. May we Christians be devoted to seeing other people not as objects for our gratification, but rather as God's unique creation, made in His image, and worthy of respect. Others are not created as objects to fulfill our selfish desires. God made sex very good. Satan took sex and warped, distorted and corrupted it. Be on guard! Don't let Satan trick you. (1 Peter 5:8-9)

If God is not at the center of our heart, then we are guaranteed to be tempted by other things.

Temptation is a battle that is not about winning or losing, it's about discovering who we really are, and what we love the most. It is a matter of the heart. It is a battle that is fought everyday throughout this church family and across the world in the lives of Christians. Although it is fought within ourselves, it does not have to be a battle we fight alone. We have help. We have EACH OTHER. We have PRAYER. And most importantly WE HAVE GOD!!!! Hebrews 2:18

\$325 after April 30th. A deposit of \$100 (non-refundable) is required at time of registration. Any balance not paid in full or registrations made within one week prior to the start of the session will pay an additional \$25.

First Time Camper Discount: First time campers are welcomed with a \$25 discount and a free camp t-shirt!

Multi Camper Discount: Families that register more than two campers from their immediate family or legal guardian (i.e., brother, sister) will receive a \$25 discount per additional camper. Applies to the 3rd or more child.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR CAMP

If you would like your child to attend camp this summer, but have concerns that you will not be able to pay for part or all of the camper fee, we do not want that to hinder your child from attending camp. Please see Dottie Grillo if you would like to receive financial assistance from the church. You will then need to go to www.manatawny.org and register your child for camp. During the registration process, you will have an opportunity to indicate that you will be receiving a sponsorship from our church. It is important that you indicate you are receiving a sponsorship (not a campship) from the Pitman Road Church of Christ,

and the amount of the sponsorship so that you will be charged the correct balance, if any, at the end of the registration. After you have completed the registration process, you must let Dottie know so that she can make sure the balance is paid before your child arrives at camp.

For members who are willing and able to contribute to sending a Pitman Road child to camp this summer, this would be the appropriate time to let Dottie know. This summer's base camp fee is \$325, but there are discounts that may apply depending on each particular child's eligibility. Write your check to the Pitman Road Church of Christ, note "camp sponsorship" on the memo line, and drop it in the collection plate or give it to Dottie.

Camper enjoy activities adapted to individual ability levels including: swimming, horseback riding, water games, arts and crafts, sports, Bible study, and much more. We are honored to say that our campers return year after year to experience the love of Christ lived out at Camp Sonshine!




"Basket" Baby Shower
