Matthew 28: 18-20

Diana and I were blessed by the numerous classes at the Pepperdine Bible Lectures this year. One of the lesson titles that caught our interest was one on discipleship entitled, "Christians are born; Disciples are made." The class reminded me of my life as a new Christian in the Air Force in Tokyo, Japan. Half way around the world, two American missionaries, Lee Bulls and Dwight Albright, had a tremendous impact on my Christian life. One of them baptized me into Christ but both of them poured their lives into mine through the principles of discipleship.

They offered me countless hours of Bible study, but they also spent time with me and allowed me to see their Christian lives. They invited me to minister with them and to work along side them. I am sure that as a new Christian I asked some dumb questions, but they were patient and helped me better understand how to live the Christian life.

As I spent time with them, I saw how serious they were about the Great Commission. They not only wanted to be good disciples of Jesus, they desired to teach others to become good disciples. With the passion they had for the Gospel, they wanted others to have that same passion. I am sure that is why only a few months after I was baptized they had me teach my first lesson. I do not remember what I said, but I do remember their help and encouragement.

This is the lesson that I needed to learn from my two missionary brothers in Christ. As Paul puts it to his younger fellow worker in Christ: "Now teach these truths to other trustworthy people who will be able to pass them on to others." (2 Timothy 2:2).

Of course we all cannot be preachers, but we can all be disciples of Jesus by passing on to others the important Gospel truths we have learned from our spiritual journey. We can share our lives with a brother or a sister. We can pour our lives into another disciple that they might in turn do the same for another brother or sister.


