# Parting Words from Patrick Mead



## Pray for Eyes Like His...

I don't know what Jesus' eyes looked like. They were probably brown as he was a 1st century Jew; but, were they big, small, hooded...? Who knows? Jews would not make any artistic representations of people or animals, so we will never know what they looked like unless Jesus tells us in heaven. In one sense, though, we know something about his eyes: what he saw.

One of the most fascinating things about Jesus, in my mind, is who and what he saw. In Mark 10, Jesus is teaching people as he walks along when a blind beggar starts shouting in an attempt to gain Jesus' attention. Jesus stops "church" — in the sense that he interrupts his teaching time — and goes to see the poor man. He heard the man, and went to see the man in order to serve the man. He made

the man a priority. He substituted the beggar's needs (healing) for his priority (teaching). That was not unusual for him. And did you notice? He even gave us his name: Bartimaeus. A blind beggar had zero standing in the time of Jesus, yet Jesus thought he was so important that he gave him time, consideration, and passed along his name to us so that we would not forget the man that no one else would have even seen.

He went in search of the Samaritan woman at a well far, far away from the paths that good, respectable Jewish men would walk. He saw a woman of the street and showed her respect and kindness even when that scandalized the religious leaders around him. He welcomed a tax collector, Matthew, into his inner circle at a time when such men were widely considered collaborators with the enemy.

While others saw worshippers at the temple and let their jaws drop at the majesty of its columns and furnishings, Jesus saw a widow who had almost nothing...and gave it anyway. On another day of worship, he alone stopped to see and care for a man with a withered hand. In a crowd, he is the one who saw the woman with the "issue of blood" and offered her healing and protection.

And he "saw" those that people in his world didn't want to see. He saw leaders of the synagogue but he also saw those cast out of the synagogue. He saw Romans and their leaders but he also saw those who lived in fear of the Romans. He saw the rich and the poor, male and female, and cared for all of them.

He saw them not as problems or as stereotypes or as interruptions, but as people, made in the image of God, dearly beloved by the Father, and deserving of our time.

In a world where media and culture demand that we divide, demean, and demote the "others" — give us eyes like Jesus. And once we have those eyes, give us his heart, too.

Max and Prisca Dauner have been ministering in France for over 35 years. Max grew up in California and received degrees in theology and history from Pepperdine University. In 1971 he moved to Geneva, Switzerland where he studied the French language and worked with the church there. Max wed Prisca Daugherty, a native of Paris, in 1977. They have been instrumental in teaching and ministering through the church in Paris, Lyon, and Montpellier, France, and since 1999, in Marseille.

Max has written several books in French, most notably commentaries on Revelation and the parables of Jesus. Max played an important roll in the creation of a French Bible program - Christians on Mission (CEM). Since it's inception, Christians on Mission has helped to train French Christian leaders throughout the French speaking world.

Max and Prisca have two sons who minister as evangelists in Europe; Philip in Marseille, France, and Justin in Cologne, Germany. They are also the spiritual parents of Constantine and his brother Alex.

It is hard to measure the enormous impact for the cause of Christ that Max and Prisca Dauner have had among the French speaking churches in Europe.


In addition, a total of \$500 was collected for Operation Kid to Kid to provide clean water for children in Peru. Thanks to all who contributed.
