So you know... Churches of Christ Disaster Relief, Inc.

Churches of Christ Disaster Relief Effort immediately responds to any major disaster in the continental United States. They contact the leadership of local Churches of Christ in or near a major disaster area. If the leadership says their local congregation wants to help, they send and turn over to that congregation truckloads of emergency food, personal hygiene, infant care, water, cleaning supplies, and pallets of additional basic needs, for them to distribute to the disaster victims. These supplies are to be given to anyone affected by the disaster, regardless of race, creed, origin, gender, or religious preference. They are a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation, that employs fifteen paid personnel. The success of the organization is due to low overhead, minimal bureaucracy and the hundreds of volunteers that help in their Nashville warehouse and distribution center. Volunteers help pack the majority of supplies in the Nashville warehouse, so items are ready to be distributed as soon as they are received. Even their truck drivers are volunteers. Local Churches of Christ across the country volunteer time and expertise to help distribute the provided supplies to the disaster victims in their area.

The best way to help Churches of Christ Disaster Relief Effort assist those in need is to donate money. Every food box, hygiene box, infant care box we send are exactly alike. All families get a food box with the same contents as their neighbors. The donations from congregations and individuals that support us, along with ordering direct from brokers and manufacturers, allow us to purchase needed supplies in large volume, at extreme discounts, whenever we need them. We are able to stretch your donation dollar to buy 3-4 times what you could purchase at retail prices. Purchasing these items allows us to be better organized, know the inventory we have, and buy the size of items we need. We don't have to wait for donated goods to come in before we can send supplies out.

Harvey Relief

As of the last Wednesday, Sept. 13th, 25 packed tractor trailers had already been sent for Harvey Survivors! Also, this faith based disaster relief organization has been in touch with 11 Florida congregations. They are connecting with local churches in Florida to get help to them. Within days after Harvey hit the coast, at the direction of our Caring and Sharing deacon, Larry Kellum Jr., our church sent a check for \$1,000 to this worthy organization. In addition, Dan started a Facebook page, and many of you helped to donate over \$1,200 to this same organization electronically via

Facebook donations. And, many of you have also made donations to the church, which are being directed to family members of Chris and Carlotta Jones that have been displaced. The Jones family are directing the \$1,050 that we have given to their family members that are most in need.

Our Church's Experience

In case you don't remember, "Super Storm Sandy" hit the Jersey coast just over five years ago. This is the same organization that immediately sent tractor trailer loads of food boxes, frozen food, cleaning supplies, infant care supplies, as well as washers, dryers and refrigerators to help families rebuild their lives in the months that followed the initial recovery efforts. Most of those supplies were distributed through our church and/or through the Gateway Church of Christ. We had an absolutely wonderful relationship with this organization's leadership, as well as with the tractor trailer drivers that delivered.

I Made A Very Big Decision This Week!

5) I talked to others whose opinion I trust. I did not do it on my own, because others know more about cars than I do. I listened to the advice of many, even though some had opinions that disagreed with others whom I also trusted. After listening to sometimes differing opinions I prayed again for wisdom...and acted!
6) I carefully researched my options. I did not buy the first car I looked at. In fact, I looked at several cars before I made a decision. What was the mileage? What reputation did the make and model have? Who had owned the car? Was it a one owner? Were there maintenance records? Had the car been in an accident? Did it have any type of warranty?

<u>7) I decided how I was going to pay for the car.</u> Could I afford the car? Could I pay cash, or would I have to take out a loan? Was I being a good steward of God's money, or would purchasing this car necessitate our reducing our weekly contribution? That was not an option!


