Two Important Announcements from Last Sunday...Plus a Personal Message

We have been praying for and mindful of our faithful servant Dan Cooper, and his resent struggles. We do appreciate how you all have responded to Dan and Katherine with your encouragements and prayers.

First, we have been in prayer about how we can best give Dan relief from the extra pressures he has experienced in ministry. Some of this due to Carlos' departure, some due to the passing of our dear brother Glynn Durham, and some due to the long term and pressing demands of ministry. This is in turn, why we hired Derrick Busch on a part time basis for this fiscal year.

But we also saw the need for more ministerial help, week in and week out, especially during week days. We therefore have asked our brother Andy Mychajlowycz to work with Dan a few days during the week. He will have a presence here at the building, to help with administrative and pastoral tasks and be available for necessary visitations to those in need.

Since Andy has served in this capacity at his previous church in Geneva, Switzerland, this seemed like a good fit for Dan, the church staff and the elders. Andy has agreed to help and will begin serving in this interim capacity beginning this week.

Secondly, we have been prayerful about how to move forward with regard to our minister selection process to hire a new minister to take Carlos' place. We all agree that this is not something to rush into and we want to listen and seek God's guidance. With that mind, we have reached out to a church consulting organization called Hope Network - this is a team of seasoned ministers and church leaders from our fellowship with years of experience and wisdom in ministering to churches of Christ.

We are therefore planning a weekend seminar with a team member of Hope Network, Greg Anderson, who will encourage, and give spiritual counsel to the eldership, deacons, ministry leaders and the whole congregation. Greg will speak Sunday morning Oct. 1st and then, the following weekend, will conduct a weekend seminar on Saturday, Oct 7th. We are available to you for any questions. More details will follow shortly.

We want to ask you to be prayerful, asking God to give us a spirit of humility and discernment as we enter into this season of transition for our congregation. We are all in this together. This our time of transition, not simply a decision for the leadership.




