

At the Crossroads

Life and Death Choices

When I was in grade school, I would stop at a corner store on the way home from school. One day, as I approached the store, I saw police cars, a crowd, and a kid lying on the sidewalk with blood pouring from his head. He was dead. The kid had tried to rob the store and the owner shot him. When the owner and the kid started their day, I'm sure they didn't imagine it would end in this way - that their choices would end up being LIFE or DEATH choices.

In Genesis, we read about Lot's choice: Abram and Lot are doing so well that they don't have enough room for their flocks. So, Abram tells Lot and his clan to choose another place. Lot looks **TOWARD** Sodom (13:10) and chooses the lush Jordan river valley. Then he moves **NEAR** Sodom (13:12). Then he is living **IN** Sodom (14:12). A bit later we see Lot sitting **IN** THE GATE of Sodom (19:1), possibly as a city official. When God destroys Sodom, Lot loses his wife and escapes only with his two daughters. Finally, he is hiding in a cave where his daughters make him drunk and commit incest with him. Their children's descendants later become tormenters of Israel.

So, where did Lot go wrong?

- (1) **His objective was wrong**. Lot chose something "good" (prosperity), without considering whether it was "good" in God's eyes.
- (2) **His attitude was wrong**. In 13:10, it says Lot looked up (haughty?) and chose "for himself"; while in 13:14 it says Abram looked down (humble) until God told him to look up to see the land God would give him.
- (3) **He couldn't break the cycle**. At each stage, when Lot was confronted with the next choice, he never changed direction. He was "all-in" on his first choice.

What about us? Is God at the heart of our choices, or do we choose things that "look good" to us and can't step back when we see we are on the wrong track? If the Lord is our life, ALL choices should go through him.


