God's Faithfulness


Endurance is the ability or strength to continue or last, especially in the face of fatigue, stress, or other adverse conditions. As we observe the life of the apostle Paul through God's Word, it's easy to see that he embodied, by God's grace, the spiritual discipline of endurance. In **2 Corinthians 4:8-12** the text makes reference to Paul's state of perplexity, persecution, being struck down, and the like. In **Galatians 5:11**, the text makes reference to Paul's persecution; this time it comes as a result of the content of his preaching. The biblical text describes various incidents of persecution as they pertain to the apostle Paul and other faithful servants of Jesus Christ. However, we must be mindful of the many believers, our brothers and sisters, suffering persecution throughout our world right now! God help them!

Here's a question: if the prophets of old, Jesus Christ, the apostle Paul, and other followers (past and present) of Jesus Christ suffered while walking in obedience to God's call, what might this imply for you and me as believers? Are we willing to suffer for Christ's sake?

If we contemplate the real possibility of suffering for Christ sake, and wonder how we will be able to stand, I have two words for meditation: God's faithfulness. Meditate on these scriptures: Psalm 34:18, Psalm 3:2-6, Lamentations 3:22-23, 2 Timothy 2:13, Romans 8:38-39.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God." -Colossians 3:16

Church Office schedule Thanksgiving week:
The office will close at noon on Wednesday, November 22 (any items for the bulletin must be submitted by noon on Tuesday, November 21), and will be closed Thursday, November 23 and Friday, November 24.



We have all been reminded by the tragic events in recent weeks that even church buildings on Sunday mornings are not necessarily safe places. Due to that

awareness, your shepherds and ministerial staff plan to implement several new security measures **IMMEDIATELY**. These are only first steps, and additional measures will be added in coming weeks.

While this will be inconvenient for some, we feel that it is an important step to help insure our safety. **Leonard Collier** has agreed to lead our **Security Team** at this time. He, or one of his team members, will always be available in the foyer to help address security concerns.

Beginning today: The glass doors on both side of the lobby will be locked during our Bible class hour, from 9:15 to 9:40. They will be unlocked again at 9:40, anticipating the morning worship crowd. During our worship hour the glass doors will again be locked from 10:15 until 11:00 when we are dismissed. Doors are always available for exiting, but during the time that most of us are in classes, or in the worship assembly, no one will be able to enter our building without our security team opening the doors for them.

We have already put some security measures in place in subtle ways, which we plan to continue, and expand upon. There are police officers that worship with us regularly, and they keep a watchful eye, as they do in any public setting, for suspicious activity or articles. Please know that we already have some strategically placed security cameras, and plan to add more both inside and outside the building.

And just as we are cautioned in many public places, we ask that "if you see something, say something."

If you have further concerns or questions, please share them with Leonard Collier, or one of your shepherds or ministers.
