If you've been reading **From Daniel's Den** the last few weeks, you've noticed that I am quite taken with the latest book by Ann Voskamp, **Be the Gift.** I've been sharing ways that we can "be the gift" as we are all at the time of year that we are thinking about giving gifts. As this year draws to a close, I want to encourage you to "Be the Gift" in 2018! Here are a few more ways that Ann Voskamp suggests to do that:

- * Be a prayer warrior. Not a panicked worrier. (p. 115) Gift someone by praying for them.
- "Jesus went without comfort so that you might have it. He postponed joy so that you might share it. He willingly chose isolation so that you might never be alone in hurt and sorrow." –Joni Eareckson Tada (p. 124)
- If your living isn't about giving, then you're already dying. (p. 126)
- * The world needs people who will defy cynical indifference by making a critical difference. (p. 129)
- * The only way to care for the disadvantaged is to disadvantage yourself, which is guaranteed to turn out to your advantage. (p. 133)
- I don't need to have things before I can offer a cup of water, open the door, my hand, or reach out to help those outside. I don't need to be thirsty myself; I only need to know I thirst too. (p. 134)
- Jesus comes as the homeless guy, the refugee, the child drinking filthy water---and you get to decide.
 Are you going to fill your life with more stuff, more safety, or more God? (p. 137)
- You are where you are to help others where they are. This isn't a Christian's sideline hobby; compassion is our complete vocation. We do not just care about people; caring is our calling. (p. 138)
- Real love is never safe! No one ever got saved unless someone else was willing to be unsafe. (p. 140)

The long-awaited sound panels have arrived!

A Servant Speaks

Come again...?

Have you ever struggled in our auditorium to make out the words a speaker is saying? A few years ago, our shepherds hired a sound consultant to analyze our auditorium and make suggestions on how to improve "speech intelligibility." The analysis showed that the many large flat surfaces in our auditorium (including the walls, ceiling, and floor) tend to cause sounds to bounce back and forth across the auditorium multiple times before dropping below the volume our ears can detect. This phenomenon is called *reverberation*, and the sound consultant said that excessive reverberation in our auditorium is the cause of the clarity issue.

Reverberation can sometimes be a good thing. For example, having a lot of reverberation in our auditorium tends to make the musical part of our worship service sound full and vibrant, but unfortunately it also tends to make the spoken part of our worship service sound muddled and indistinct. To improve the clarity of our pulpit ministry, without losing the rich sound of our music ministry, the sound consultant suggested that we add sound absorbing panels to the back wall of our auditorium. This is because sound panels mounted on the back wall are in the most effective location to prevent reverberation of sounds coming from our auditorium loudspeakers, which are primarily used to amplify the pulpit microphone. By not applying sound panels to the front and side walls of our auditorium, this should continue to allow the sound of our congregational singing to reverberate off these other surfaces and provide much of the same fullness and vibrancy we are used to hearing.

I am excited to announce that the long-awaited sound panels recommended by the sound consultant have arrived! Over the coming weeks, the panels will be installed incrementally on the back wall of our auditorium. Our hope and prayer is that these panels will help increase the ability for both our members and visitors to clearly hear and understand the transforming gospel of our Lord Jesus, and that we would all be compelled to *come again!*


Have Financial Peace in 2018!


