#### **Month by Month Events and Activities**

#### July:

Pitman Road Church of Christ marches in the Pitman July Fourth Parade for the first time, cheered on by those viewing parade from the Coopers' lawn. Church parking lot open to the community for viewing of fireworks; REFUGE Band



plays free outdoor concert and teens hand out hot dogs and water. Feeding the Hungry Meal in Trenton. Vacation Bible School; Robin Steward heads up our children's program and Patrick Mead



returns again to speak to teens and adults. Family Promise Host Week. Jr. High I Week at Camp Manatawny, directed by Aaron Pearl, about 45 from Pitman Road attend as staff or campers. After 12 years, Aaron announces his retirement as director. Andrew Holden preaches Sunday morning sermon. Andy Mychajlowycz announced as new LIFE Group Coordinator.

#### August:

Elementary 1 Week at Camp Manatawny, directed by Manny Vander Vennen; about 30 members attend as staff or campers. Fellowship picnic honoring Craig and Katie Young. New Pitman Road University adult Bible class curriculum is rolled out. Camp Manatawny hosts 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. Andy Mychajlowycz preaches annual LIFE Group sermon. Elders appoint Robin Steward as ministry leader for Children's Education.

#### September:

Women's Ministry Clothing Swap, coordinated by Brittany Spaeth and Rebekah Lazar. Munchkin Ministry, Kids for Christ, Jr. Worship, and LIFE Groups resume. Twenty-nine backpacks are donated to West Atco Youth in Action. Elders announce Andy Mychajlowycz will be assisting ministerial staff for an indefinite period of time. Annual "See You At the Pole" prayer service, coordinated by Tim and Melody Davis. Congregation is asked to fill out Congregational Health Survey from Hope Network.

#### October:

Women's Equip Ministry kicks off another 3-month prayer emphasis. Elders bring in Greg Anderson, a consultant from Hope Network, for weekend seminar to speak to the congregation about upcoming transitions. Annual events: Fun Fall Festival and Trunk or Treat. Family Promise Host Week. Over \$3,000 from Caring and Sharing budget is sent to help with hurricane relief efforts in TX and FL. Elders share results of Congregational Health



Survey. Rebekah Lazar is appointed as the new director of Camp Manatawny Jr. High 1 Week; she makes history as the first woman to direct at Manatawny! (More on that in the bulletin soon!)


#### December:

#### **Churches of Christ in the United States**

The 2018 edition of Churches of Christ in the United States just arrived at our building. It is the first edition published in the last three years. There is good news and bad news about our fellowship. The good news is that in 2018 there are 1,447,271 Adherents in the Churches of Christ in the US and Canada. (Adherents has come to mean the number of people typically attending a Sunday worship assembly, including the following: members, guests, and children). These 1,447,271 adherents worship at 11,965 congregations. The bad news is that both the number of congregations and the number of adherents in the churches of Christ has dropped nearly every year since 1994, with the number of adherents topping off at 1,684,872 in 1990.

Churches of Christ in New Jersey have declined from 37 congregations with 3,926 Adherents in 2015, to 35 congregations with 3,637 Adherents in 2018. There are currently four counties in NJ with no church of Christ (Cumberland, Hunterdon, Passaic, Sussex, and Salem). Of those 37 congregations, 25 have a Sunday attendance of 100 or less...with 15 of those reporting an attendance of 50 or less. Only two of the congregations in New Jersey report a congregational attendance of 201 or more, Newark and Pitman Road. All of this in New Jersey, the most densely populated and most highly taxed state of the 50 states. We have our work cut out for us, as New Jersey now boasts a population of 8,980,298!

Our church building is in Gloucester County and the two closest counties to us are Camden and Cumberland. Put those three counties together, and our church is called out to connect with 1 million folks. That's a daunting task. Our church, is called to connect with multiple languages, multiple ethnicities, and multiple social groups. We can do it, by God's grace. I am inspired and motivated by what 12 untrained men did 2,000 years ago in a world with multiple languages, multiple ethnicities and multiple social groups. (Mt. 28:18-20)
