We're All A Mess

Choosing a Life That Matters "Believe God, Not the Deceiver"

As I would hope and imagine that with many of us, this series entitled *Choosing a Life that Matters*, based on the book by Dennis Rainey, has been both enlightening and convicting. Today we're setting our attention and hearts on the blessing and admonition to "Believe God, Not the Deceiver." If you have ever participated in the mental gymnastics of trying to figure out what life is all about, exhausted yourself pondering your purpose and calling, or simply tried to make sense of your world, here again is the pivotal contrast requiring our daily decisive choice, "Believe God, Not the Deceiver." Our choice in this very foundational matter will greatly impact our ability to answer the above questions for the glory of God, and it will positively or negatively impact our fellowship with our neighbors.

Now, you may be thinking, "This is an obvious choice!" I would agree, but, it is a daily choice, and in it there is one who has been described as "more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made." (Genesis 3:1) In the context of John 7:37-38 and 8:42,44, he is described as a murderer, one who does not stand in the truth, one who has no truth in him, a liar, and the father of lies. With such opposition on our daily spiritual journey, how can we strengthen our faith and deepen our belief in the God who loves us and has already made us victorious through Jesus Christ? Dennis Rainey outlines six spiritual disciplines that will add "muscle" to our faith. They are as follows: 1. Be intentional about Bible intake. 2. Search, discover, write, and take "Vitamin A" (Application) daily. 3. Start a "rock collection." 4. Obey. 5. Read books and mine hearts. And finally, 6. Evict unwelcome houseguests. 
