## Don't be Fooled by Me! • Some Thoughts on How to "Connect"

Don't be fooled by me. Don't be fooled by the mask I wear! For I wear a mask. I wear a thousand masks—masks that I'm afraid to take off—and none of them is me! Pretending is an art that is second nature with me, but don't be fooled.

I give the impression that I'm secure, that all is sunny and unruffled, within and without; that confidence is my name, and coolness is my game; that the waters are calm, and I'm in command and I need no one. But don't believe it. Please don't.

I'd really like to be genuine, spontaneous, and me; but you have to help me. You have to help me by holding out your hand, even when that's the last thing I seem to want or need. Each time you are kind, gentle and encouraging, each time you try to understand because you really care, my heart begins to grow wings — very small wings, very feeble wings, but wings. With your sensitivity and sympathy, and your power of understanding, I can make it. You can breathe life into me. It will not be easy for you. A long conviction of worthlessness builds strong walls. But love is stronger than strong walls, and therein lies my hope. Please try to beat down those walls with firm hands, but with gentle hands, for a child is very sensitive, and I AM a child.

Who am I you many wonder. I am someone you know very well. For I am every man, every woman, every child...every human you meet.

## Respectful Meditation

Respectful Meditation: As I respectfully meditate on the students, staff, and people that have been hurt and or killed in the far too many school shootings, (pause to reflect with God); as I respectfully meditate on all of the people that have been hurt and or killed as a result of racial bias and comprehensive prejudicial hatred, (pause to reflect with God); as I respectfully meditate on the various divisions and the overall state of our country, (pause to reflect with God); as I meditate on the impact that sin has had on my life, your life, and mankind as a whole (pause to reflect with God); I cry out to God for wisdom, for mercy, for patience, for strength, and for a renewed willingness to be salt and light in the midst of so much lawlessness and hurt! I'm coming to realize more and more that being salt and light requires my willingness to be made uncomfortable! My part as a Christian is to be willing to be uncomfortable for the sake of a hurting world that needs Jesus Christ. Biblical meditation: Matthew 26:36-56, Luke 23:34, Matthew 9:36, John 3:16

In the midst of all the sin, hurt, injustice, and confusion, we are called to worship God! Is it possible to worship God in the midst of so much lawlessness and hurt? How can we remain focused and encouraged? What is the fuel and motivation for our worship in the midst of so much lawlessness and hurt?

What does it mean to worship God? Worship includes expressions of reverence, adoration, love, devotion, and care for God and His plans; being fully immersed in His mercy! When we reflect on the mercies of God (Romans 12:1-2), our hearts should be encouraged. What are the mercies of God? God's mercies are everything He has given us that we don't deserve! Here's a list of just some of what we have in Jesus Christ: eternal love, eternal grace, the Holy Spirit, everlasting peace, eternal joy, saving faith, comfort, strength, wisdom, hope, patience, kindness, honor, glory, righteousness, security, eternal life, forgiveness, reconciliation, justification, sanctification, freedom, and intercession to name a few. Worship God, not comfort.


