# From Daniel's Den

## My Reflections on the Movie, Paul, Apostle of Jesus Christ

Last Sunday afternoon our LIFE Group attended a matinee showing of this movie. I love that those who produce movies are seeing the value in producing biblically based movies. (Much better than the alternative!). After the movie, we had a yummy lunch at Texas Roadhouse; I enjoyed my favorite meal on their menu...it's called "Roadkill!"

The movie was not exactly what I expected. It is, for lack of a better way of describing it, it is a true story, based on scripture, with a little imagination about the way things could have happened. It takes a few details about the Apostle Paul and his life after his trial while awaiting his death, and fills in the blanks with educated guess work. I didn't see much that I thought COULD NOT have happened that way, so it did not leave me angry about biblical inaccuracies. The story line is reasonably feasible, but the addition of the captain of the prison, his sick daughter, and his wife is totally speculative (no hint of such exists in scripture). In the movie, Luke writes Acts during this same period of time from Paul's memories; I think it is more likely Luke wrote a short time after the last events recorded in Acts took place.

The struggles of the church in Rome during those days is also conjecture, but certainly could have happened exactly as it is portrayed. What I thought was very powerful was the faith of the martyrs who went to the arena to their deaths for the entertainment of the Romans, and the unwavering determination of Paul to finish the work God had given him to do. Many words of scripture from Paul's writings were worked into the dialogue. The movie contains significant violence, so I would not recommend taking children under 12 years old.

I'm glad I went, I left inspired, and I would encourage you to see it.

To get the entire story as it is recorded in scripture, read the last half of the book of Acts (chapters 12-28).



Paul Tripp, in his November 17, 2016 article entitled, "Why We Desperately Need the Body of Christ," makes this statement: "Your walk with God is a community project. The isolated, separated, loner, Jesus-and-me religion that often marks modern church culture is not the religion that is described in the New Testament." So, as we abide in Christ, the New Testament progression and blessing must result in deeper fellowship with one another; if we're truly abiding in Christ. What is meant by deeper fellowship? According to Paul Tripp in the above mentioned article, he states the following regarding fellowship, "Many of us live in endless networks of terminally casual relationships, in which conversations seldom go deeper than weather, food, politics, the coolest movie that's out, or the latest cute thing your child did." WOW! He further states, "Most of what we call fellowship never really rises to the level of the humble self-disclosure and mutual ministry that make fellowship actually redemptively worthwhile."

So, while "connecting" in Jesus Christ, we must go beyond terminally casual relationships, in which conversations seldom go deeper than weather, food, politics, the coolest movie that's out, or the latest cute thing your child did. Are we ready to go deeper? Stay tuned for Part 2.


