

The Garden of Gethsemane



This garden is not your typical American garden. There are no tomatoes, carrots, eggplant, or squash in this garden. Rather, it is an olive garden, just outside of Jerusalem, in the Kidron Valley. What strikes you most about the Garden of Gethsemane, even today, is its peacefulness (after all the tour buses have left for the day). It is one of the few places in Israel where you can personally experience something almost identical to the way Jesus would have experienced it.

In anticipation of our 13 day trip to Israel and Greece, I've been reading a lot about biblical sites we will visit. And this week, I've been reading about Gethsemane.

It is in this garden that Jesus prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me." Each of us who has ever anticipated a time of great pain or suffering has prayed something similar to what Jesus prayed that night. Then later, the prayer that we wish we could pray, but find it so difficult to utter, "Yet not as I will, but as You will." Then, Jesus goes to connect with, and find support from His closest friends...and He finds them sleeping.

"I don't know about you, but for me, submission is not easy. I really don't like having to obey. I'm a wild stallion that doesn't want to be tamed. I'm a two year old whose favorite words are 'Mine' and 'No;'" says F. LaGard Smith.


