In Two Weeks



The Day of Pentecost was 50 days after the crucifixion of Jesus, and it is the day we mark as the birthday of the church. Jesus rose from the dead and walked in Palestine; eating, drinking, and talking with people before He ascended back into heaven. Ten days later the Holy Spirit fell on apostles who were gathered together in Jerusalem. They began speaking in tongues (languages) so all who were assembled, regardless of where they were from, could hear the good news about Jesus.

Although May 20 is not the actual Day of Pentecost, we will celebrate it during our worship service, as Peter's sermon, recorded in Acts 2, is read in many languages: English • French • Greek • Hebrew • American Sign Language • Chinese • Russian • Italian • Twi • Korean • Japanese • Armenian • Creole • German • Hungarian • Polish.

In addition, this will be "Mission Emphasis Sunday." There will be displays in our lobby highlighting mission opportunities that we have been, are, or plan to be involved with. We're All A Mess

Never Alone

Have you processed your thoughts and feelings? What theological and/or faith questions are you pondering? To acknowledge and embrace the heaviness of heart that we're all feeling, **KNOWING** that our sister Bonnie Wilson is with our Lord whom we **ADORE** and **LONG FOR** is to be expected. "We are Family!"

Resting in Jesus Christ as our foundation is the first step towards healthy grieving and true healing. What might we experience as the grieving process begins? Elisabeth Kübler-Ross, a Swiss-American psychiatrist is often referenced for those experiencing the journey of the grieving process. Her five stages of grief help to categorize this difficult, but hopeful process. Here's a very brief summary. The first stage is **Denial**. It's described as being in a state of shock and or going numb! Denial actual helps us pace our feelings of grief and helps us survive the loss. The second stage is Anger. According to Ross, anger is a necessary stage of the healing process. It's a pathway of truly embracing the loss so that you can heal. This anger might extend to friends, the doctors, your family, yourself and your loved one who died; but also to God. The third stage is Bargaining. In this stage, one might find themselves making, "If then," promises with God. "If you allow my loved one to live, I'll serve you for the rest of my life." The fourth stage is Depression. After bargaining, our attention moves to the present. Here, empty feelings present themselves, and grief enters a deeper level. It's important to note that this depression is not mental illness, but a very appropriate response to a great loss. The fifth and final stage is Acceptance. This stage is about accepting the reality that our loved one is physically gone and recognizing that this new reality is the permanent reality.

If you need to process your thoughts and feeling, please do not hesitate! I'm here for you. "We are Family!"


