We're All A Mess

Make Every Sunday & Wednesday an "O I I"

If you're like me, I need reminders! How about you? I don't have to remind you that life is busy and our memories fail us from time to time; okay, a lot! When was the last time you forgot an appointment? Or, when was the last time you wrote yourself a reminder on that little piece of paper, only to forgot where you put that little piece of paper? Well, since the evolution of the smart phone, I've become smarter, well, not really! The smart phone is an amazing piece of technology with seemingly endless capabilities! There are so many capabilities of the smart phone that I just don't utilize. Why? It's overwhelming! It's like capability overload right in the palm of our hands. Now, I agree, there are icon and seemingly endless apps available on our phones that could actually help us organize and remember important things in the midst of the busyness of life. I'm developing the habit of utilizing the calendar and alarms within my phone to prompt me and remind me, "Hey Derrick, don't forget to..." Now, with all that being said, I still forget things from time to time even with my smart phone, but I'm getting better! How am I overcoming that overwhelming feeling as it relates to my smart phone? Two steps: Learn an app, Use the app, Immediately! Otherwise, I will forget.

Are there any spiritual nuggets hidden in this example of capability overload when referring to the smart phone? I believe so, especially when it comes to hearing the Word of God preached daily. It's difficult to remember it all! Would you agree? In my opinion, the easiest way to remember scripture and biblical principles, is to apply the, "O I I" methodology! The acronym "O I I" stands for, "Obey It Immediately!" The longer that we delay in obeying what we hear, the easier it is to forget what we've heard. Have you ever said to yourself, "I'll do that later?" What generally happens? You got it, we forget! I believe that same outcome applies to each of us spiritually. If we do not obey the truth immediately, we will forget it! Here's a spiritual exercise to try taken from the July 17th sermon, "Inside Out Christian & Inside Out Church" Matthew 14:13-21. How can we apply these principles immediately?

- 1. Be willing to be interrupted. Matthew 14:13,14
- 2. Have compassion, by meeting people where they are. Matthew 14:13,14
- 3. Our compassion must move to action. Matthew 14:14
- 4. Give ALL that you are, and ALL that you have to Jesus! Matthew 14:15-21


