Fake News is Real!

There's a scam going around currently; people are called by someone claiming to be an official with the IRS. That "official" claims that the victim owes a bogus tax bill. Often, the victim is conned into sending cash through wire transfers or prepaid debit cards to settle a fake debt. That is "Fake News." The IRS has told the public time and again that they will not use this kind of tactic.

How are you persuaded to believe something?

- Based on the source or the person telling you.
- Based on an impassioned plea or convincing story which creates an emotional response, convincing us that something is true.
- Based on "evidence," like facts, figures, and words. A lot of us like this kind of "proof."

Even the gospel of Jesus Christ has been twisted by fake news. Jehovah's Witnesses' *New World Translation of the Holy Scriptures,* Joseph Smith's *Book of Mormon,* and Sun Myung Moon's *Divine Principle* are all examples of fake news disguising itself as "good news." Hundreds of thousands of people have been taken in by these and hundreds of other fake gospels. There is only one true gospel (Romans 1:16-17).

The first fake news story ever!

You can read it in your Bible, Genesis 3:1-5. God explicitly told Adam and Eve not to eat of the tree in the midst of the garden. God said, "You shall not eat of the fruit... neither shall you touch it, lest you die." Satan, the serpent, enters with fake news... "You will not surely die!" "When you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." Stated as a fact, but it is an out and out lie. Adam and Eve believed, based upon a convincing story that led to an emotional response. That fake news led to their death

Be careful who you believe and what you believe. Check out your sources. The devil is a liar. Ask Adam and Eve about "Fake News." They "swallowed" the fake news (pun intended) and look where we are now!


