About 30 years ago, I taught what I thought was a pretty basic Bible class. One of the ladies of the church came to me looking very pleased. She said that after attending my class, her husband started talking about being baptized.

I knew that I had no reason to get high on myself or give myself too much credit. This is why I felt that way: First, I knew that the wife's example over the years was a much more important factor than my



class. Second, another teacher next week might have gotten the same response. The man's heart had been touched and he was ready to accept Jesus. Third, I know that nothing happens without God's help. I was just glad to be a small part of someone coming to Jesus. And I have been a small part of it many times.

So, if you don't feel like you have the ability to bring people to Christ single handedly, be comforted, you are not alone, not by a long shot. What you can do is to be part of the team. You can do this many different ways. You can do this with love, friendliness, teaching on any level, serving or in many other ways. Little contributions add up to very big things.

Here is an illustration that I used at small group. Some of the ladies thought it was just a bit unsettling. Forgive me, but it makes the point very well. One time, when I was deer hunting in PA, some men had shot a deer and were tracking it. It was struggling to walk. It walked up to a man and his son who were hunting. They saw it and boom! They dropped it! As far as they were concerned it was theirs. They were unaware of all the work the other men had done. They got the prize; the other men got nothing.

Sometimes, our work to win people to the Lord goes unnoticed. Someone else gets noticed. Your work may never be noticed by anyone other than God. In heaven it will be noticed.
