New Sermon Series
Beginning Today

P40days of Prayer

Life doesn't always go as planned. At some point, you'll face impossible obstacles and barriers — situations that make you think there's no way this is going to work out. But God wants to help you handle uncertainty when it comes your way. He is ready and willing to give you a breakthrough, but it doesn't just happen spontaneously; breakthroughs happen when you seek them. And the way you seek them is through prayer. Throughout the *40 Days of Prayer* sermon series, you will learn how to cultivate a powerful prayer life and experience breakthroughs in your relationship challenges, financial difficulties, bad habits, health crisis, and many other areas of your life. Here is a preview of our first four messages:

Today: Do You Really Want to Grow Up?

When it comes to our faith, the Bible says we are not meant to remain as children but instead to grow up in Christ. In this message, Derrick gives us an inside look into our spiritual growth campaign, 40 Days of Prayer. We learn six laws of spiritual growth and action steps toward a deeper relationship with God, and we discover the importance of feeding on the Word, developing spiritual habits, and growing together in community.

November 11: A Beginner's Guide to Prayer

From Cinderella to Aladdin, these fairytale stories are based on characters whose lives are changed with the granting of a wish. When it comes to prayer, we often treat it like a magical wand that we wave at God when we want our dreams to come true. But the Bible teaches us that prayer is a relationship with God, and not an enchanted tool. In this message, Derrick shares the four foundational truths of prayer that will help us to see prayer in a different way, and how to connect with God in conversation. You'll learn the importance of talking to him about everything in simple and sincere ways. Find out how prayer will draw you closer to God and why answered prayers are his gift of grace.

November 18: Who Do You Think You Are Talking To?

Have you ever experienced a stressful or difficult time that left you questioning the presence of God? Sometimes it takes days, months, or even years before we realize that God used that experience as an opportunity to rely on him through difficult times. The more we begin to understand what God is really like, the more everything can fall into place, including our prayer life. In this message, Dan will demonstrate how God's plan will always be good, including suffering for the benefit of others. We learn how he is the God of second chances and why he doesn't always say "yes." And we discover everlasting encouragement and renewed strength for the days ahead.

November 25: Praying in Five Dimensions

Do you ever feel like your memory is slipping or that you have a hard time remembering things? In this message, Derrick teaches us the relationship between memory and prayers and what the Bible says about this deep connection, teaching us through Communion with a tool to remember the five dimensions of prayer. Discover how praying in these five dimensions can awaken your faith with a new freshness that is personal, passionate, and in partnership with the Holy Spirit. Get ready to take your faith to the next level by looking back to the cross, inward at Jesus living inside you, and forward to your future in Christ.

"Maker of Heaven and Earth." "Lord God Almighty." "Most High Over All the Earth." "Helper of the Fatherless." "Defender of the Widows." "The One to be Feared." "God Most High." "Righteous Judge." "Ever Present Help." "Loving God." All of these are words or phrases used by the Psalmist to describe our Creator and Sustainer.

"God Is in Control!" This foundational truth about God should impact our prayer lives.

We're All A Mess

The Truth That Empowers Our Prayers

There is one foundational truth about God that has captured my heart for the past few days. My hope is that this truth, which is not new, obviously, will also capture your heart and collectively remind us of just how blessed we are. I'm SO EXCITED! This truth about God can wrestle and restrain the emotions that have the potential to destroy our lives; or prohibit us from living the abundant life that Jesus Christ came to unleash by His love demonstrated on the cross. See if these harmful emotions and biblical text tug at your heart: <u>Anger</u> Genesis 4:1-8, <u>Fear</u> Genesis 20:2, 3,11, Exodus 2:11-15, Job 4:13-16, <u>Jealousy and Envy</u> 1 Kings 21:1-14, <u>Terror</u> Daniel 5:6-9, <u>Lust</u> 2 Samuel 11:1-5, James 1:13-17, <u>Hatred</u> 2 Samuel 13:2-20, <u>Greed and Covetousness</u> Joshua 7:16-21, <u>Depression</u> 1 Samuel 28:15-25, <u>Guilt</u> Matthew 27:3-10, <u>Resentment and Hatred</u> Acts 9:4-9, Acts 26:9-12, Galatians 1:13, <u>Pride and Arrogance</u> 3 John 9, <u>Selfishness</u> Acts 5:1-11, and finally, Sorrow Mark 10:22. Which of these emotions did you find yourself saying, "Yes, that's me!"

This truth about God is both seen and demonstrated in the very first verse of the Bible. Do you know what it is? In fact, this truth about God is revealed in **Genesis 1:1** and is seen straight through to **Revelation 22:21** and beyond, demonstrated in God's faithfulness to every generation.

What is this foundational truth about God? Here it is, "God Is in Control!" Yes! God is still in control and is not hindered, swayed, or puzzled by the things of this world, nor the things of our lives, regardless of how difficult they may be! He's Simply in Control!

This foundational truth about God should impact our prayer lives. When we individually and collectively recall the fact that we're praying to the one and only All Mighty God, who is in complete control, that's true empowerment and peace!

As Dan and I begin the series **40 Days of Prayer**, let's collectively pray for: breakthroughs; the development of daily habits of prayer; growth in attendance; congregational unity; and that we collectively experience God's Blessings!


