Selection Committee Update

The minister selection process has entered a critical stage, so we wanted to give you a view of how the process is progressing.

The Candidates

As you may remember from prior updates, the minister selection process is not an open job posting to which potential candidates can apply. Instead, we have contacted 30+ recommenders – individuals who know the Pitman congregation and who are well situated to identify and recommend candidates who would meet the qualifications for the pulpit minister position and who would be good fits within our body. Over the last two months we have received the names of 14 men (but additional names may still come in the future). All of them have excellent academic qualifications. Many have served as pulpit ministers at other congregations, and all have preaching experience. Most have also served in other ministerial roles (youth minister, worship minister, etc.).

Several have taught or are currently teaching at Christian colleges and are considering returning to full-time ministry. And two are wrapping up their commitments as missionaries (one in China and one in Mozambique), establishing and growing churches and training leaders. Several have experience in community outreach. The Lord has blessed us with excellent potential candidates.

The Process

After reviewing each candidate's qualifications, we dropped two from consideration. The remaining candidates were all contacted

to confirm their interest in the position. We provided them with links to our "We Are Pitman Road" prospectus documents and video, a link to our web site, and a description of the selection process. We also had initial phone calls with several candidates to answer questions. Five of the candidates have elected not to continue through the process for a variety of reasons (deciding to stay in their current position, accepting a job at another congregation, or deciding that we would not be a good match for them). Two of the candidates are still praying and discussing with their wives about whether to start the process with us. Five others have confirmed their interest and are proceeding through the next 3 steps in the process:

Providing information – this includes submitting their latest resumes, a cover letter explaining why they would be a good fit at Pitman and why we would be a good fit for them, links to videos of sermons they have preached, written outlines of their sermons, and written answers to 5 deep questions we have sent them.

Initial interviews – these are 90 minute interviews via video with each candidate that include 2 interviewers from our side (a brother and a sister) and an observer/note taker.

Second interviews – these are interviews via video with each candidate, together with their wife, and include follow-up questions with a focus on their joint perspectives on ministry, family life and their respective involvements in the body.

Seven members of our team are serving as reviewers of the candidate written answers and the videos of their sermons, scoring them according to a set of evaluation criteria that the committee has defined.

Where We Are Today



On November 15, we had initial interviews with two of the candidates who are far along in the process. We will have second interviews with them in early December. At this stage, we believe that both of these candidates are qualified for the pulpit minister position and we continue to evaluate their interview responses and all the material they have submitted.

Once the committee feels that we have identified a top candidate for the pulpit minister position, we will recommend that candidate to the elders. The elders are responsible for the

final stages of the negotiation with the recommended candidate. If, for any reason, the recommended candidate is not confirmed, the selection committee will continue through the process with the qualified candidates that remain in the pipeline until the pulpit minister position is filled.

We are deeply grateful for your continued prayers as we proceed through this process and seek out God's will and guidance.

Potential candidates are being interviewed. Sermons of candidates are being reviewed. References are being checked. Our Selection Committee needs, and even covets our prayers. They are charged with a heavy responsibility. They need God's direct help in this process, and they are soliciting our prayers. If you have not been doing so, please join me praying for them regularly. And, let them know personally how much you appreciate them for their hours of work. Let them know you're praying for them.

THE PATTERN FOR PRAYER (Brief Reflection)


As we continue collectively, to engage in our 40 Days of Prayer series, you may have found that there's a phrase or a word that you have encountered during your reading, or during the sermon series that has challenged you to the very core of your beliefs about prayer. This is good! As we continue this journey together, here are two questions that may help us in our growth process in prayer: Have your prayers become more God centered, than self-centered? Have you been challenged to change your core beliefs concerning prayer?

Well, as I reflect on part two of lesson four entitled, "THE PATTERN FOR PRAYER," the phrase that has caused me to reflect deeply is as follows: "The purpose for prayer is not to conform God to my way of

seeing things; the purpose for prayer is to conform me to the Kingdom, power, and glory of God." The word that grabbed me in this phrase is "conform," which led to two further questions, "Have my prayers been fixated on my attempt to conform God to my way of seeing things? And secondly, "Have I been "offering" prayers to God with a fixed answer in mind that conforms to my wishes and deep seated heart's desire?" It was eye-opening to see that my prayer life at times was very "Derrick" centered. This "Derrick" centered praying interrupted the peace that God has offered.

Why? Because, self-centered prayers ignore the foundational purpose for prayer; God's glory! Self-centered prayers ignore the fact that God, in all of His wisdom and power is in control. Self-centered prayers give the illusion that we are in control; and this results in forfeiting the peace of God. Be encouraged by Philippians 4:6-7.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
