
# We're All A Mess

## FEAR!

As I think about Jesus sending out His disciples, it's interesting to me to note His words, His focus, and His stance that He chose to take at such a time. As Jesus sends them out to do ministry, to lovingly interact with the world, and to proclaim boldly the reign and lordship of Jesus Christ...He warns them about **Fear!** Is this warning still applicable to you and me today? Do we struggle with fearing man, more than we fear God? This misguided fear has the potential to greatly impact our ministry to the 21<sup>st</sup> century world. We are called to **speak** and **lovingly** live out the Gospel of Jesus Christ with **loving boldness!** 

Ed Welch of the Christian Counseling & Educational Foundation, in his book, *When People Are BIG and GOD is Small*, is a powerful resource! Here's an excerpt from the book below. It's a must read!

"However you put it, the fear of man can be summarized this way: We replace God with people. Instead of a biblically guided fear of the Lord, we fear others.



Of course, the 'fear of man' goes by other names. When we are in our teens, it is called 'peer- pressure.' When we are older, it is called 'people-pleasing.' Recently, it has been called 'codependency.' With these labels in mind, we can spot the fear of man everywhere.

The problem is clear: People are too big in our lives and God is too small. The answer is straightforward: We must learn to know that our God is more loving and more powerful than we ever imagined. Yet this task is not easy. Even if we worked at the most spectacular of national parks, or the bush in our backyard started burning without being consumed, or Jesus appeared and wrestled a few rounds with us, we would not be guaranteed a persistent reverence of God. Too often our mountain-top experiences are quickly overtaken by the clamor of the world, and God once again is diminished in our minds. The goal is to establish a daily tradition of growing in the knowledge of God."

We are called to speak and lovingly live out the Gospel of Jesus Christ with loving boldness!



**Dwight Thompson** is at home and has begun new treatment. **Elinda Hunter,** treatment pending.


**Rich Rinnie** remains hospitalized after triple bypass surgery and post-surgical complications. Jo Ann requests no visitors. Meals are appreciated.
