Written Early in the 2nd Century



"Christians love one another. They never fail to help widows; they save orphans from those who would hurt them. If a man has something, he gives freely to the man who has nothing. If they see a stranger, Christians take him home and are happy, as though he were a real brother. They don't

consider themselves brothers in the usual sense, but brothers instead through the Spirit of God. And if they hear that one of them is in jail, or persecuted for professing the name of their redeemer, they all give him what he needs. If it is possible, one of them bails him out. If one of them is poor, and there isn't enough food to go around, they fast several days to give him the food he needs. This is really some new kind of a person. There is something divine in them."

Written Early in the 4th Century

"When you sit down to eat, pray. When you eat bread, do so thanking God for being so generous to you. When you look at the sky and the beauty of the stars, throw yourself at God's feet and adore the one who in wisdom has arranged things in this way. Similarly, when the sun goes down and when it rises,

when you are asleep or awake, give thanks to God, who created and arranged all things for your benefit, to have you know, love, and praise their Creator."

Written Early in the 13th Century





Below is a powerful prayer from the 14th century:

Dear Lord, it seems you are so madly in love with your creatures that you could not live without us. So you created us; and then, when we turned away from you, you redeemed us. Yet you are God, and so have no need of us. Your greatness is made no greater by our creation; your power is made no stronger by our redemption. You have no duty to care for us, no debt to repay us. It is love, and love alone, that moves you! Amen. - Catherine of Siena (d. 1380), Italian tertiary of the Dominican Order, which means she lived by the spirit of the order but did not take official religious vows


